

- Demographic data excluded




REPRESENTATION PER STAKEHOLDER GROUP


REPRESENTATION PER PRECINCT




Police station or Precinct [67 voters]






3. If you were a victim of crime in the last 3 years, did you report it to the police? Aggregate Results [67 votes]






4. When you reported a crime to SAPS, they arrived at the crime scene on average: Aggregate Results [67 votes]





5. When you phoned the police station, how long on average did it take for your call to be answered? Aggregate Results [67 votes]









9. During the last week, when did you see SAPS patrolling your area? Aggregate Results [67 votes]








11. How do you rate the level of professionalism of SAPS in your area? Aggregate Results [67 votes]





12. In your opinion, how professional is the provision of victim support / counselling services at your local police station? Aggregate Results [67 votes]







13. If you have ever received counselling via victim support services, how professionally was your referral handled? Aggregate Results [67 votes]








15. Do you think there are enough police resources (e.g. police officers, equipment etc) for your community? Aggregate Results [67 votes]







16. Do you think that police resources are being utilized effectively / optimally at your local station? Aggregate Results [67 votes]






20. In your opinion, what is the main contributor of crime? (possible causes) Aggregate Results [67 votes]






21. In your opinion, what is the main motivator of crime? Aggregate Results [67 votes]






22. In your opinion, what is the main oppportunity for crime in your area? Aggregate Results [67 votes]






23. Identify the areas where you feel most unsafe Aggregate Results [149 votes]






24. Identify the time you feel most unsafe in your area Aggregate Results [67 votes]






25. When would you like to see improved police visibility in your area? Aggregate Results [108 votes]






