
## **METHODOLOGY**

- Demographic data excluded




## REPRESENTATION PER STAKEHOLDER GROUP




## REPRESENTATION PER SECTOR

#### Please indicate in which police station precinct you reside [Dem 2 of 4] [NOV=65]












## 2. Were you a victim of crime in the: Item 2 of 28 [NOV = 65]






## 3. If you were a victim of crime in the last 3 years, did you report it to the police? Item 3 of 28 [NOV = 65]






4. When you reported a crime to SAPS, they arrived at the crime scene on average: Item 4 of 28 [NOV = 65]


















# 13. If you have ever received counselling via victim support services, how professionally was your referral handled? Item 13 of 28 [NOV = 65]






## 14. If you are involved in partnerships against crime, please indicate the formations/structures you are most actively involved in Item 14 of 28 [NOV = 65]






## 15. Do you think there are enough police resources (e.g. police officers, equipment etc) for your community? Item 15 of 28 [NOV = 65]






## 16. Do you think that police resources are being utilized effectively / optimally at your local station? Item 16 of 28 [NOV = 65]








## 18. In your opinion, how would you rate the effectiveness of the witness protection programme? Item 18 of 28 [NOV = 65]






#### 19. Please select the priority crimes which must be the focus of SAPS in your area Item 19 of 28 [NOV = 65]






## 21. In your opinion, what is the main motivator of crime? Item 21 of 28 [NOV = 65]






## 22. In your opinion, what is the main oppportunity for crime in your area? Item 22 of 28 [NOV = 65]






#### 23. Identify the areas where you feel most unsafe Item 23 of 28 [NOV = 65]






#### 24. Identify the time you feel most unsafe in your area Item 24 of 28 [NOV = 65]






## 25. When would you like to see improved police visibility in your area? Item 25 of 28 [NOV = 65]






#### 26. Please select the 3 key safety needs in your opinion Item 26 of 28 [NOV = 65]




