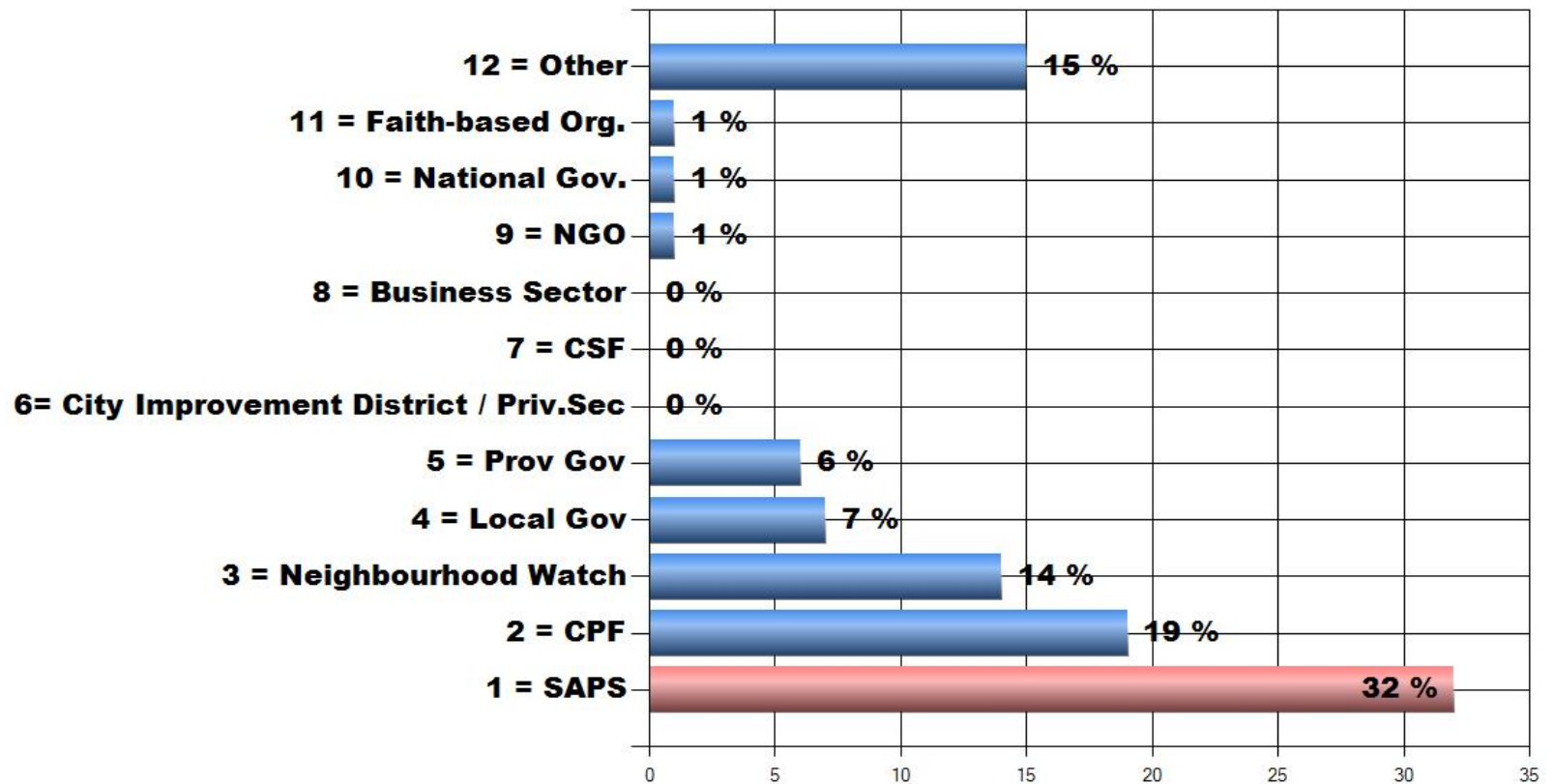

- Demographic data included

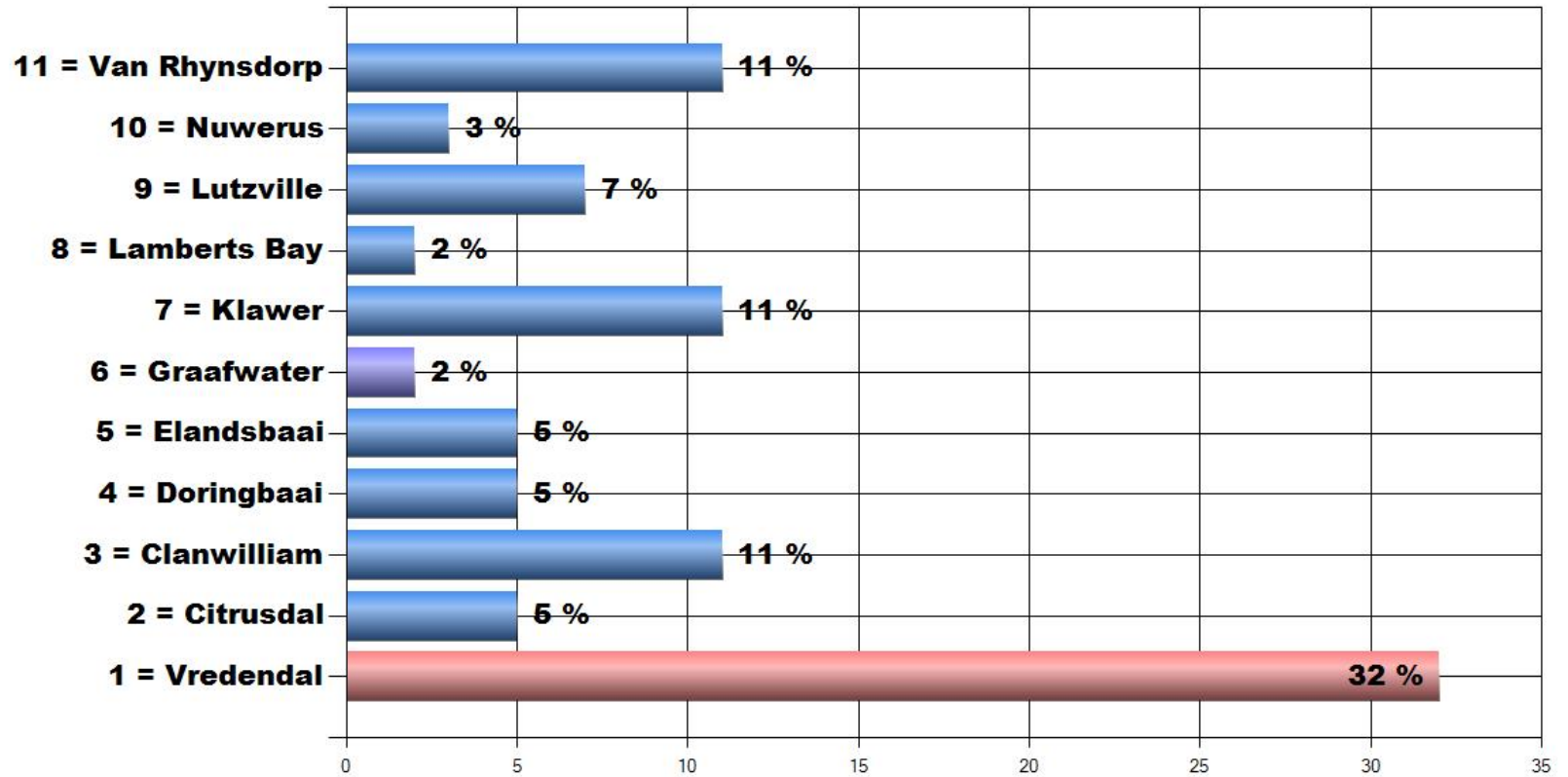

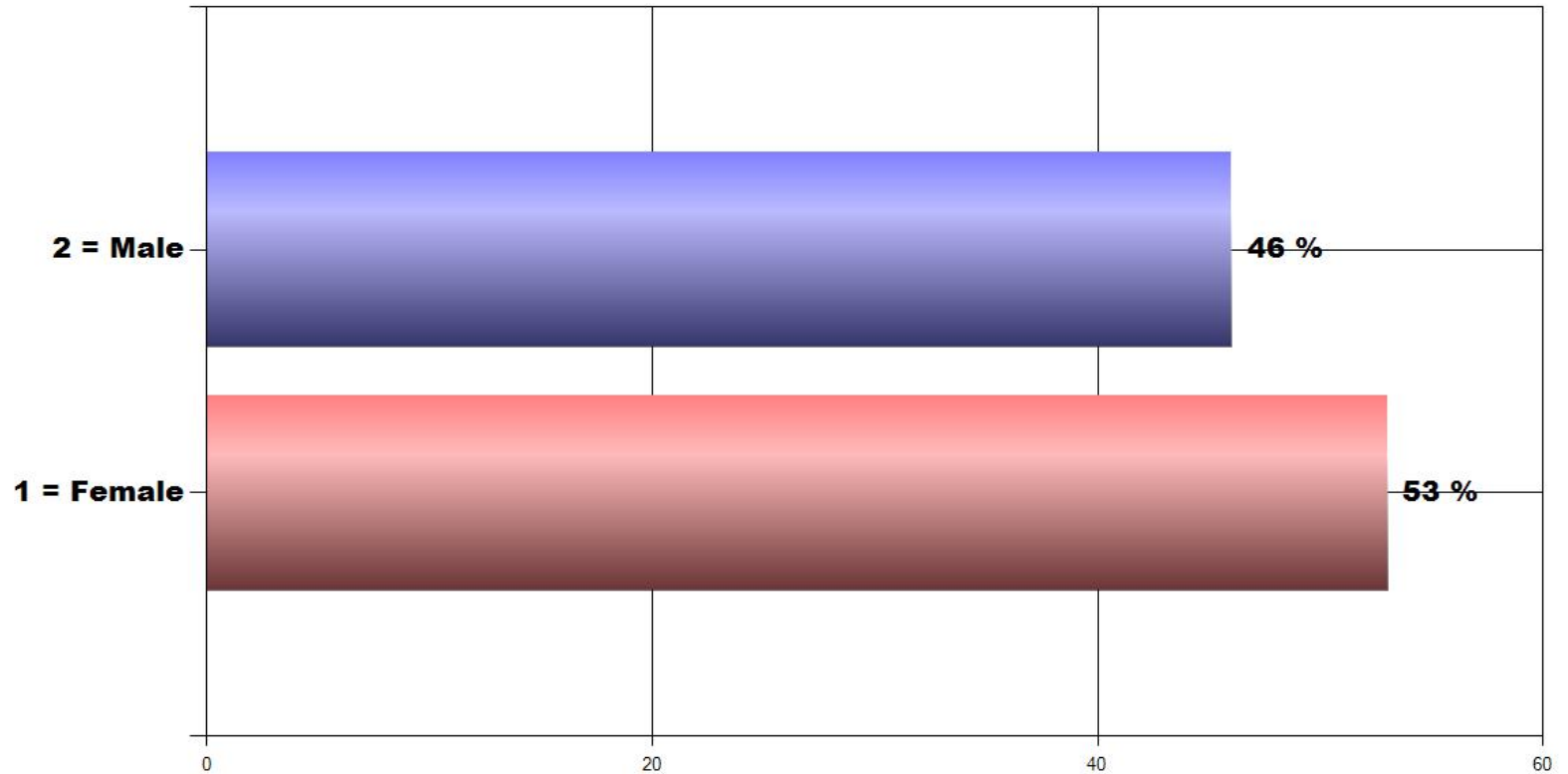
REPRESENTATION PER PRECINCT

Please indicate in which police station precinct you reside [Dem 2 of 4] [NOV=77]

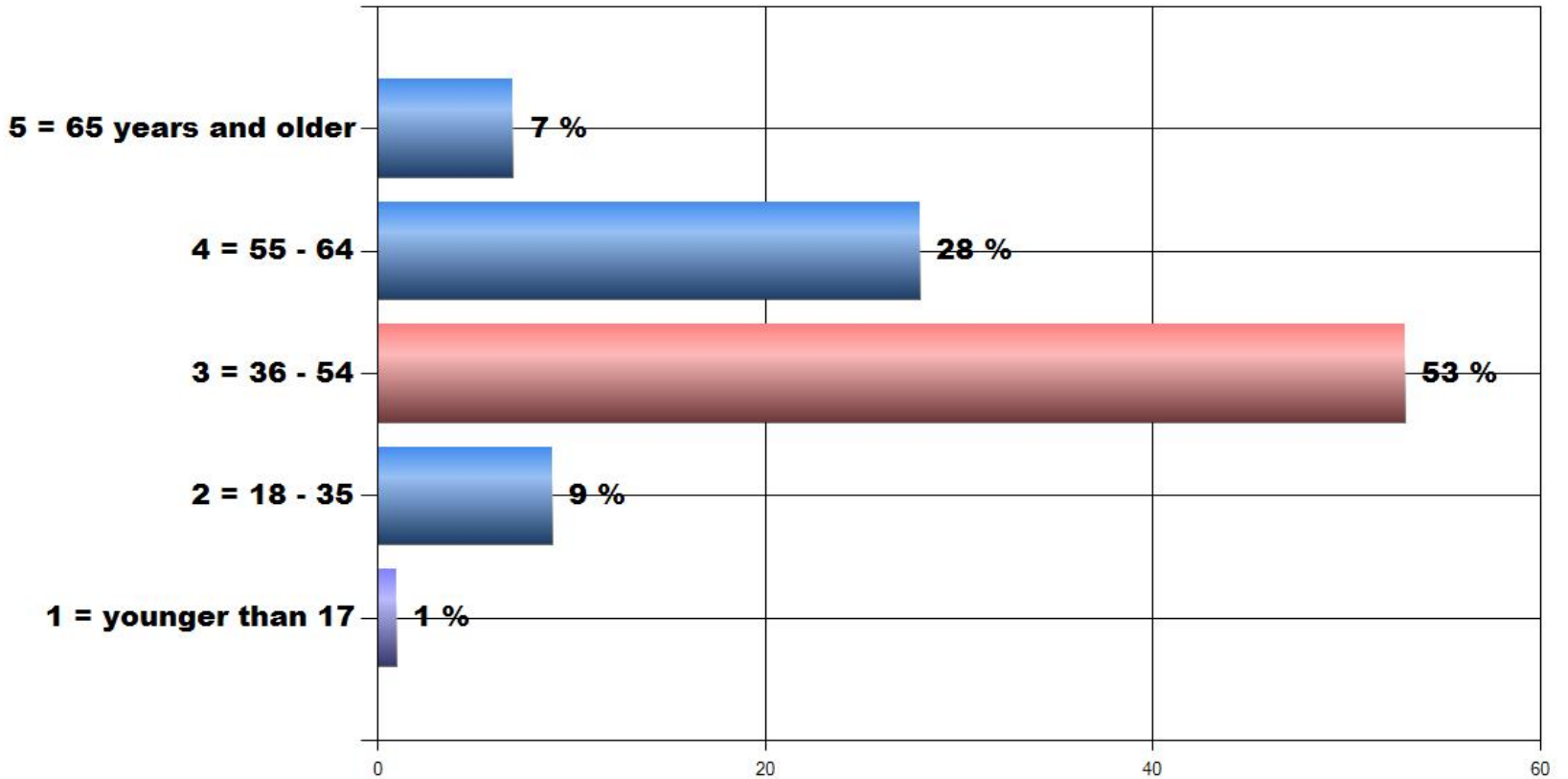


REPRESENTATION PER GENDER

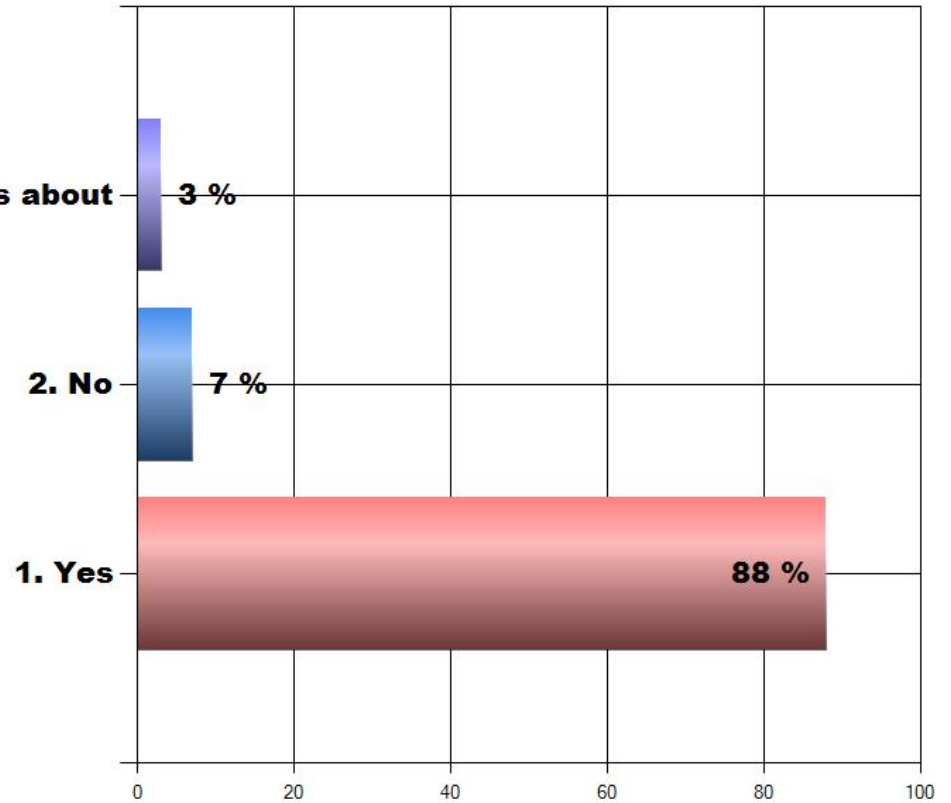

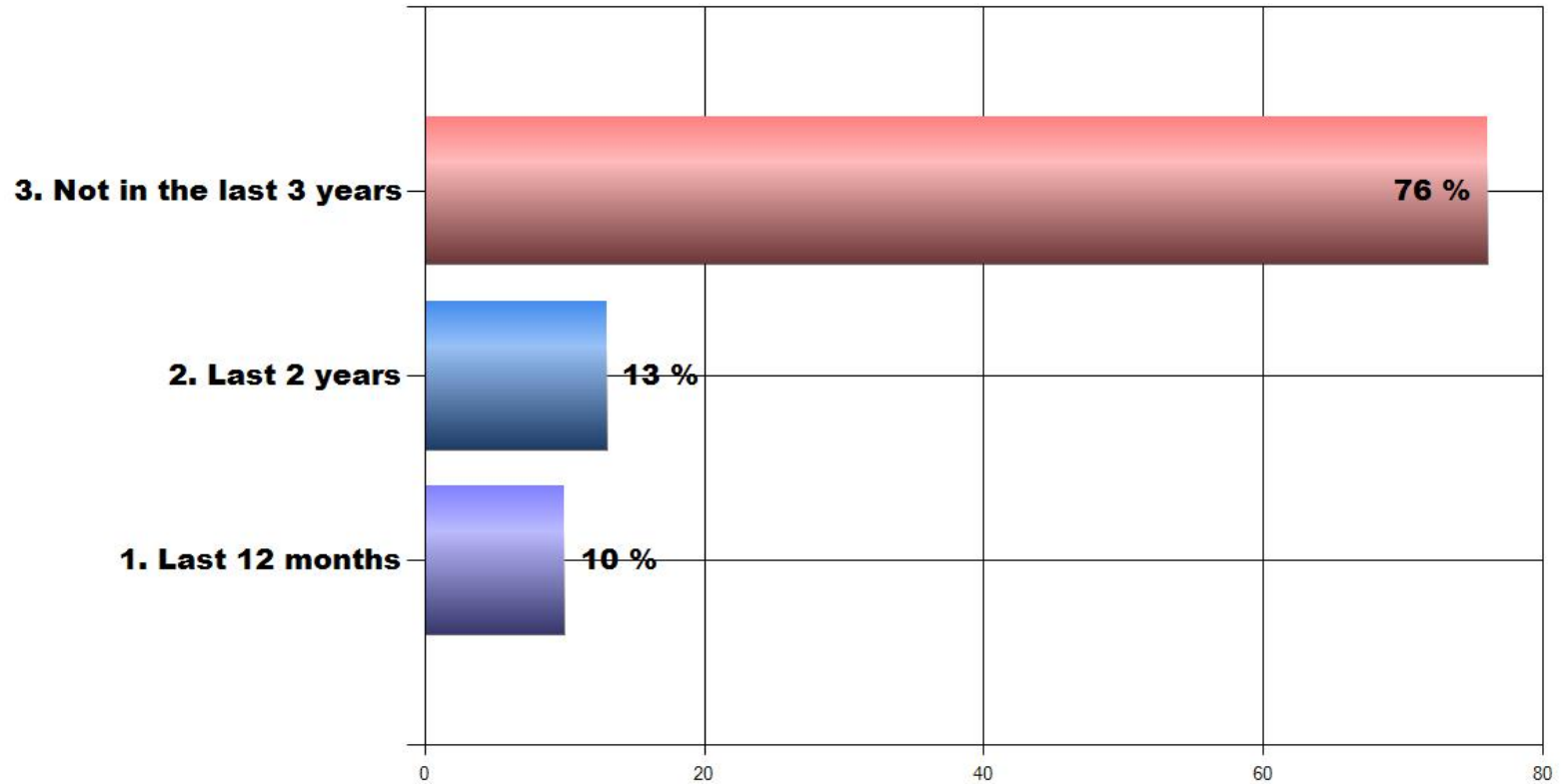

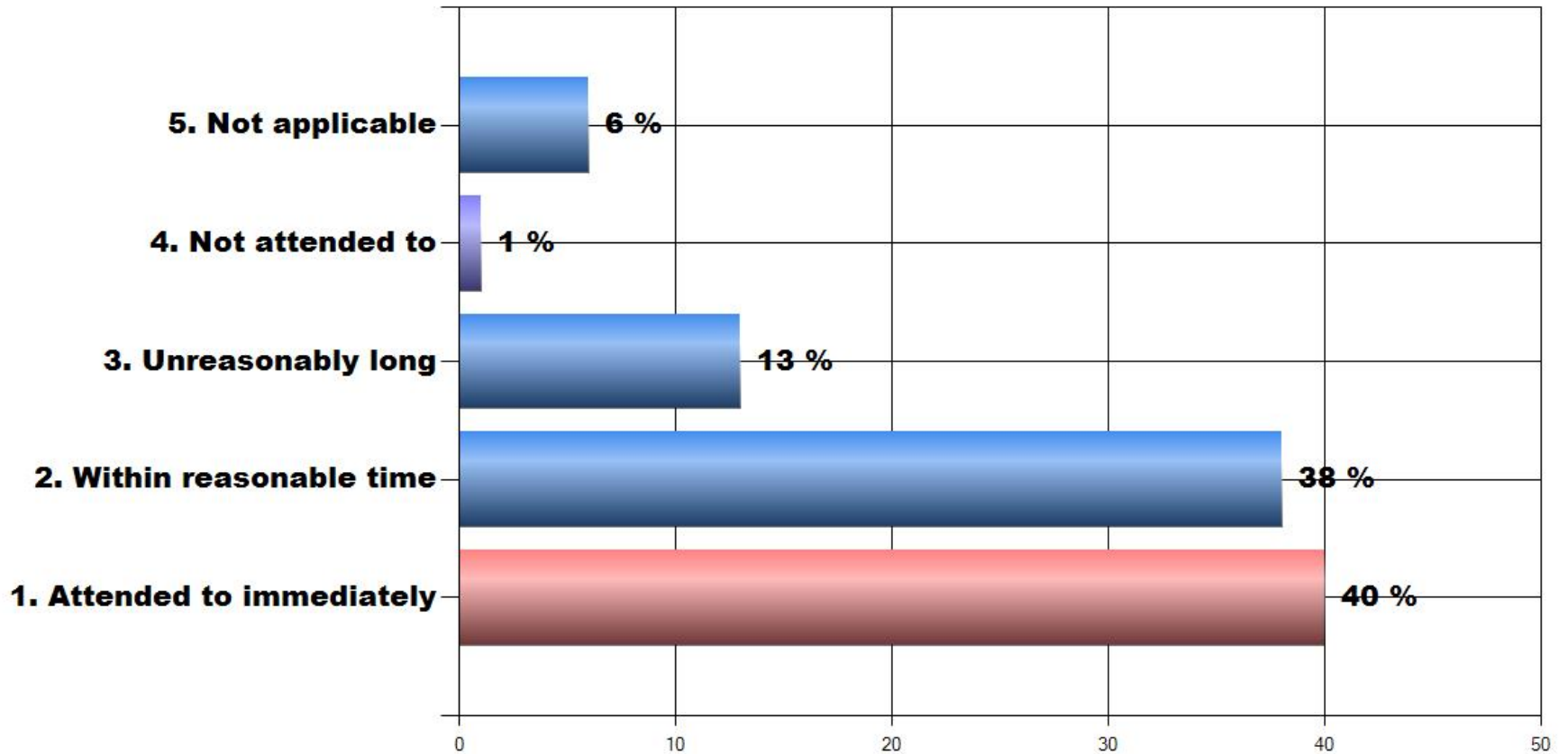

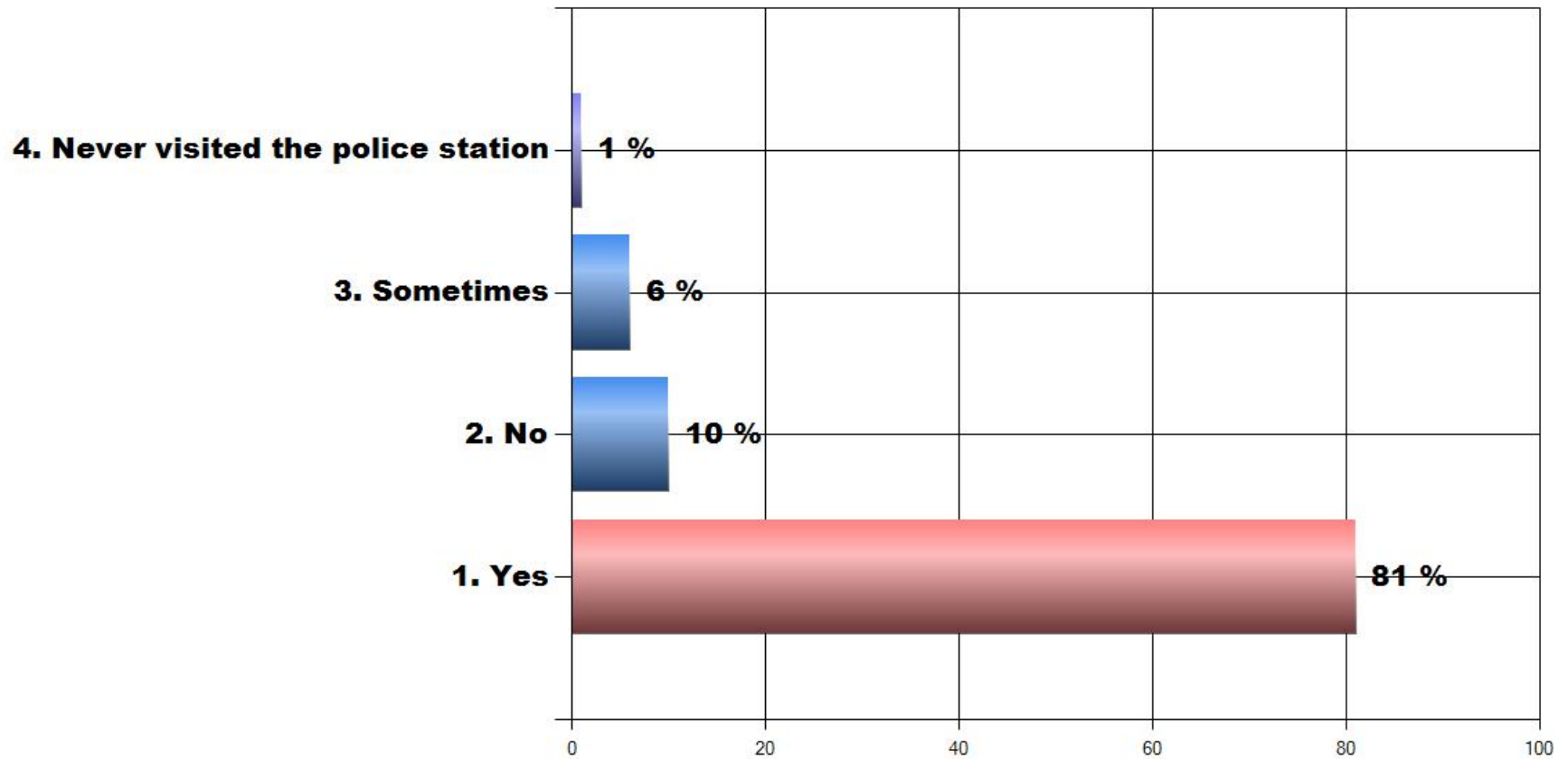

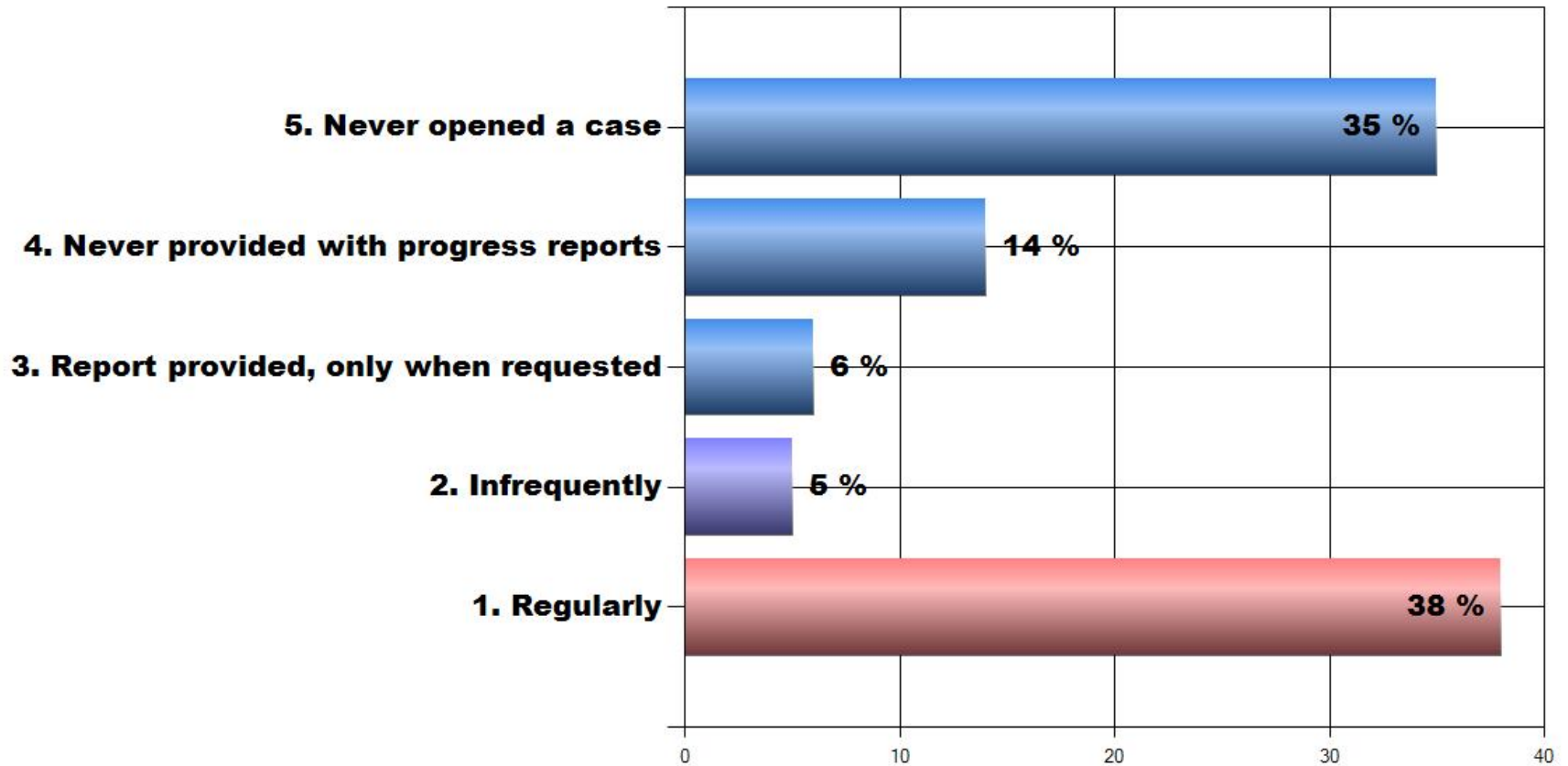

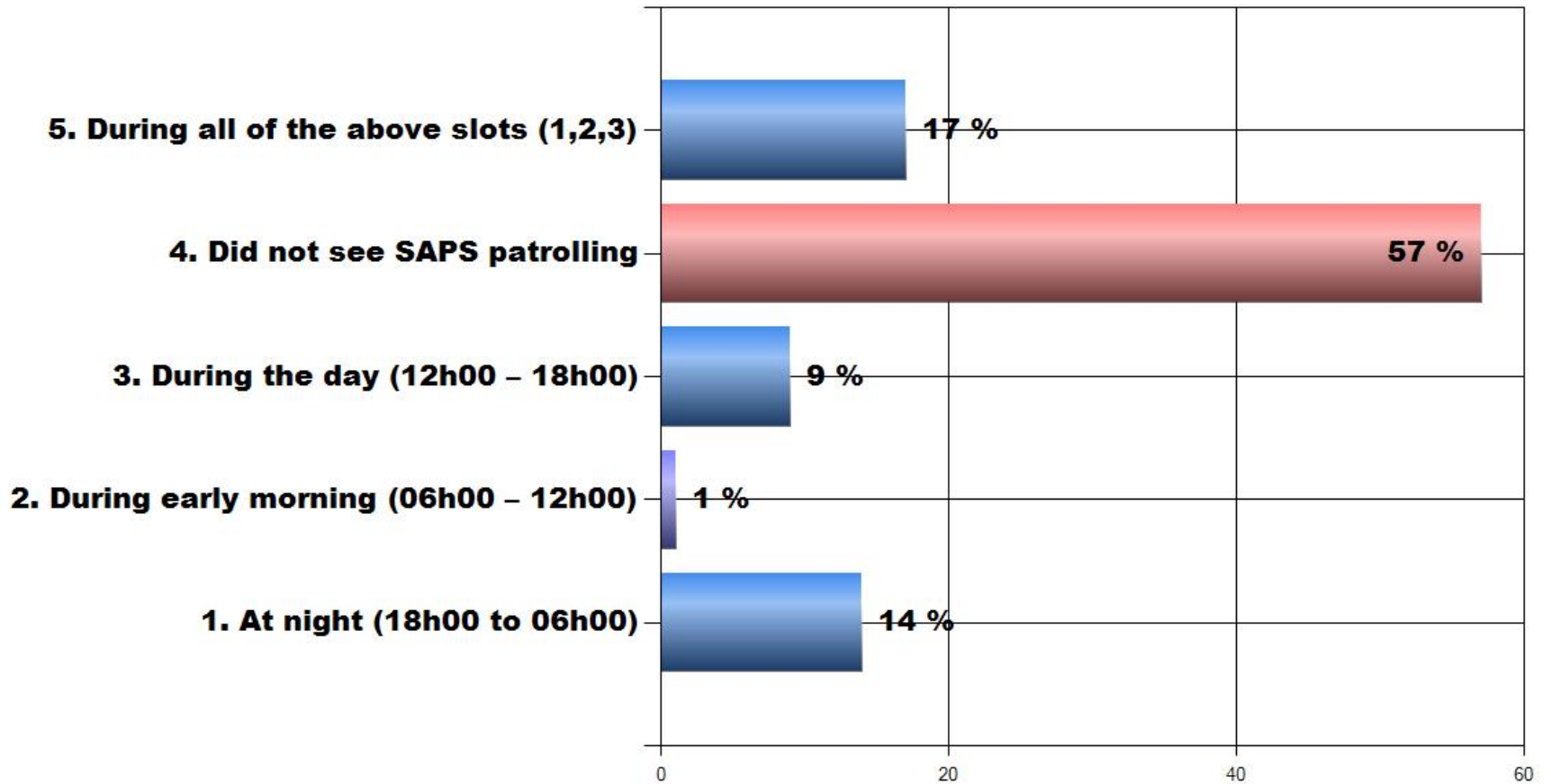

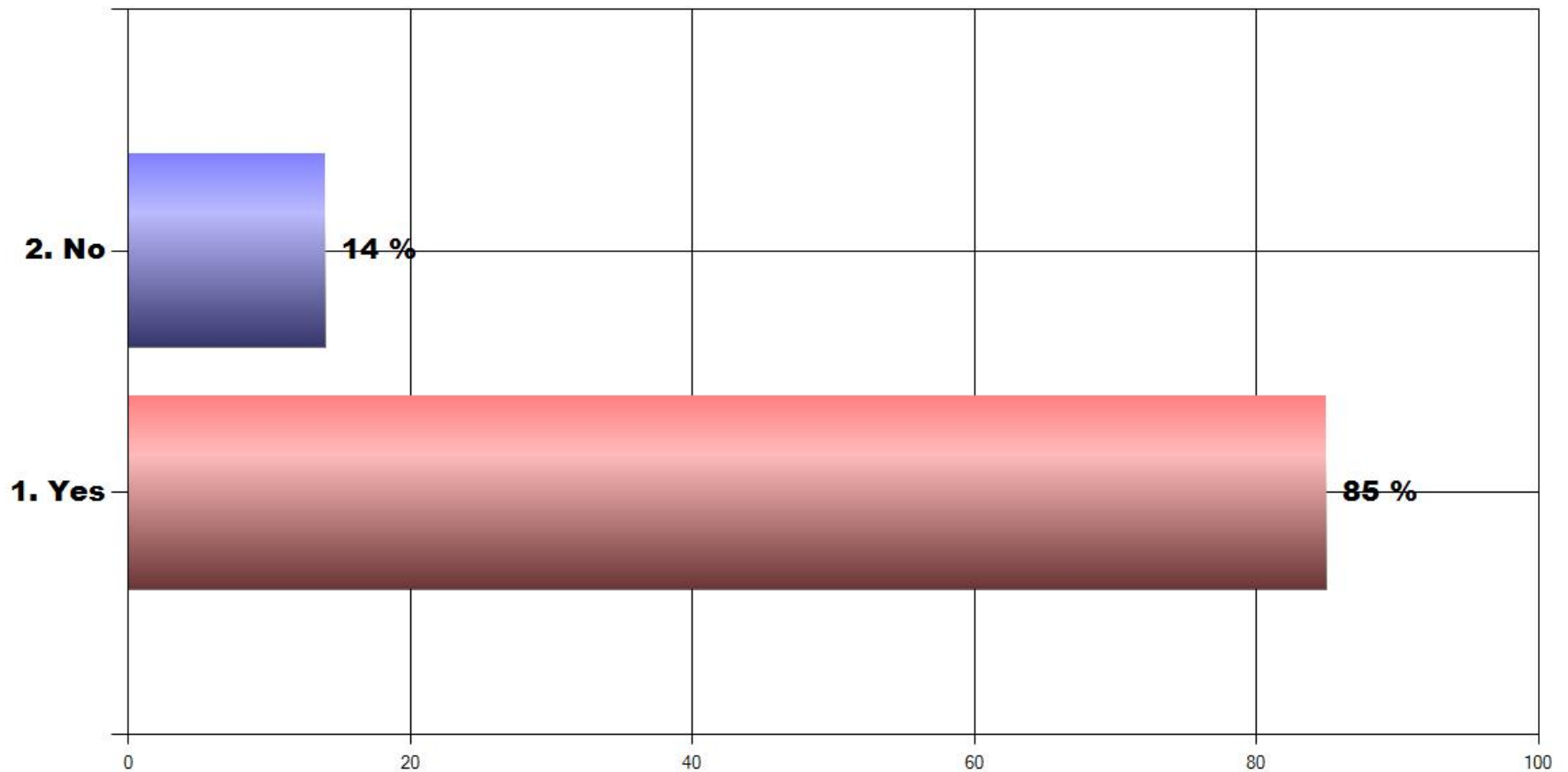

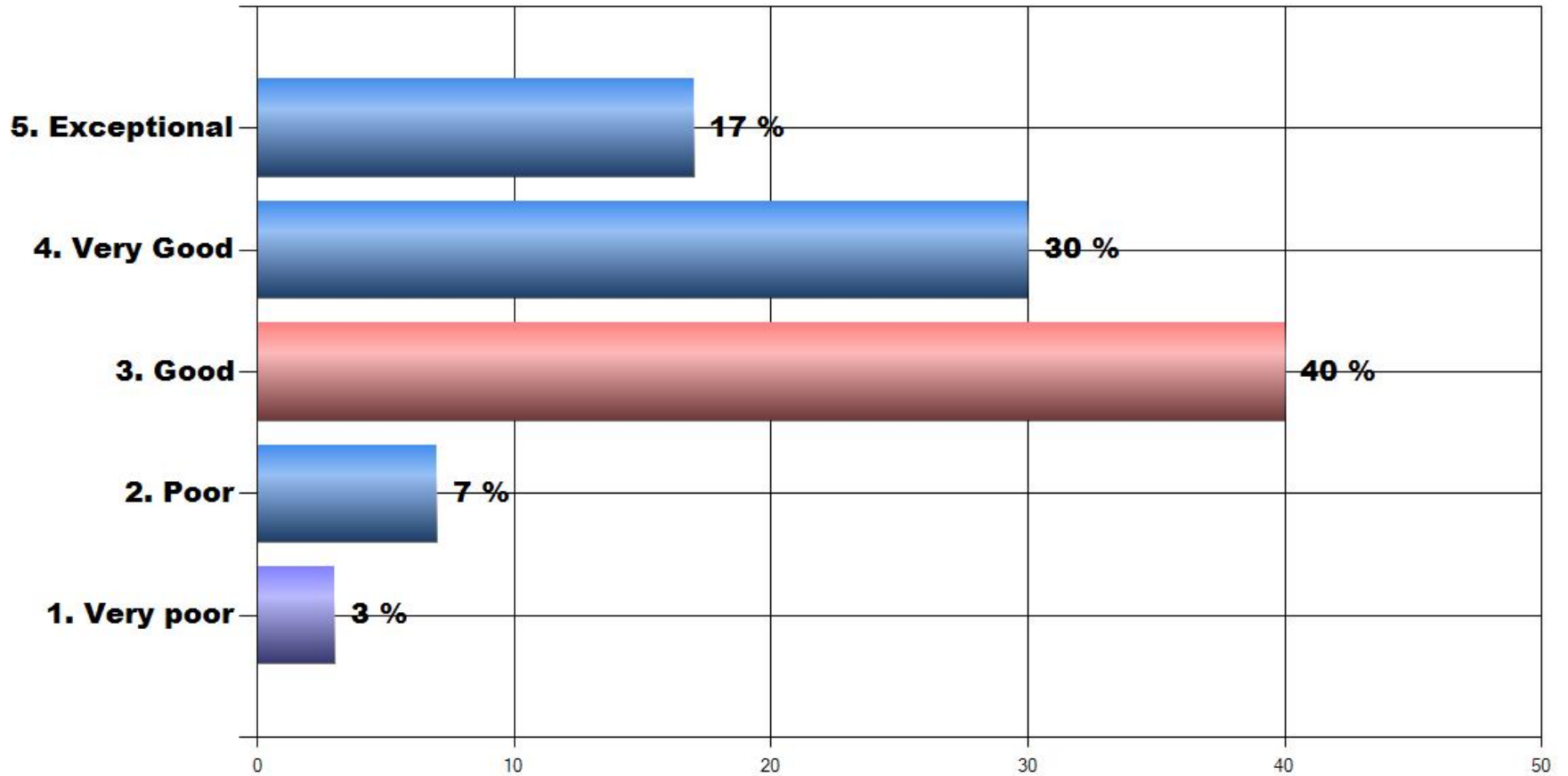

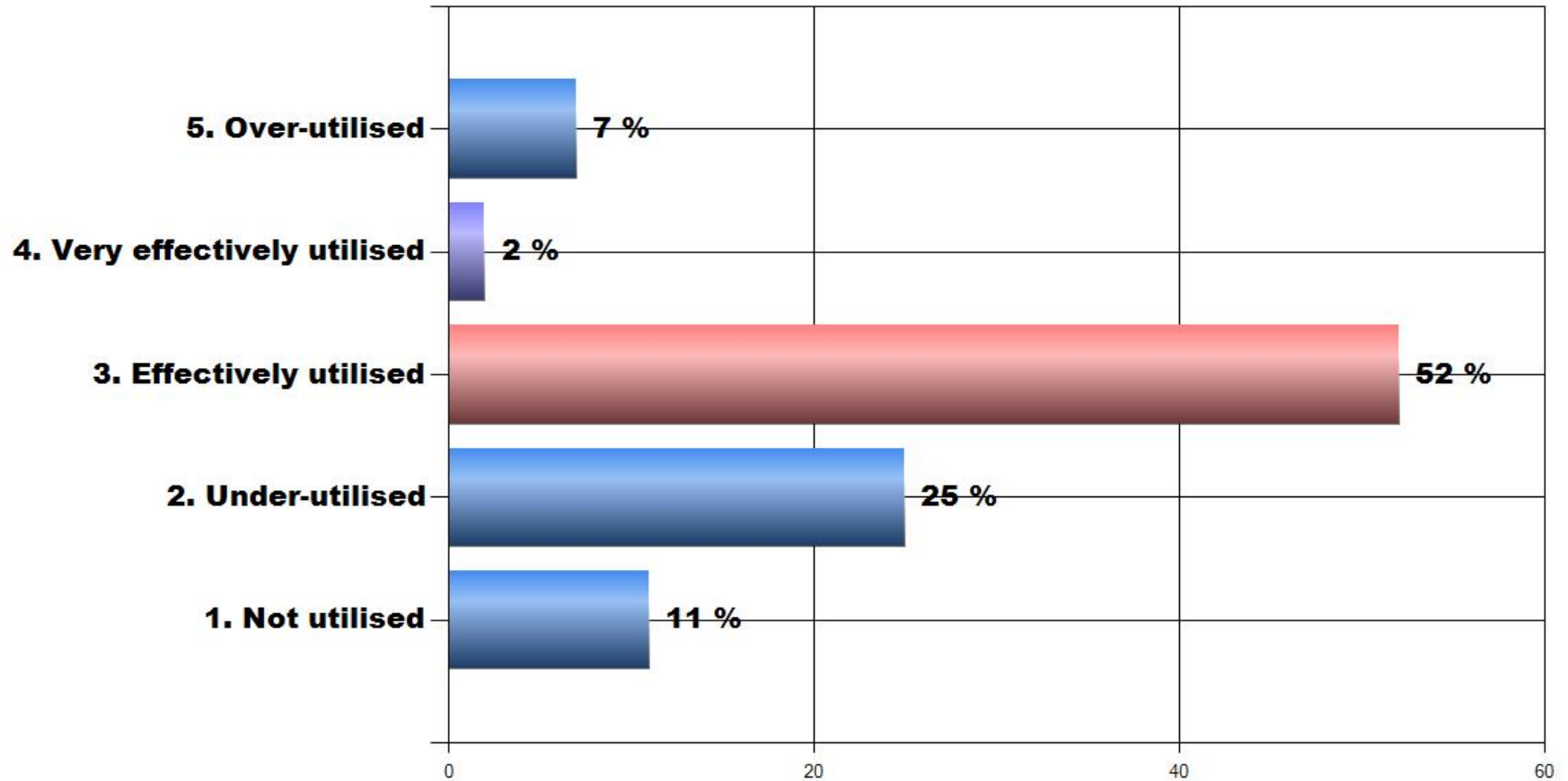

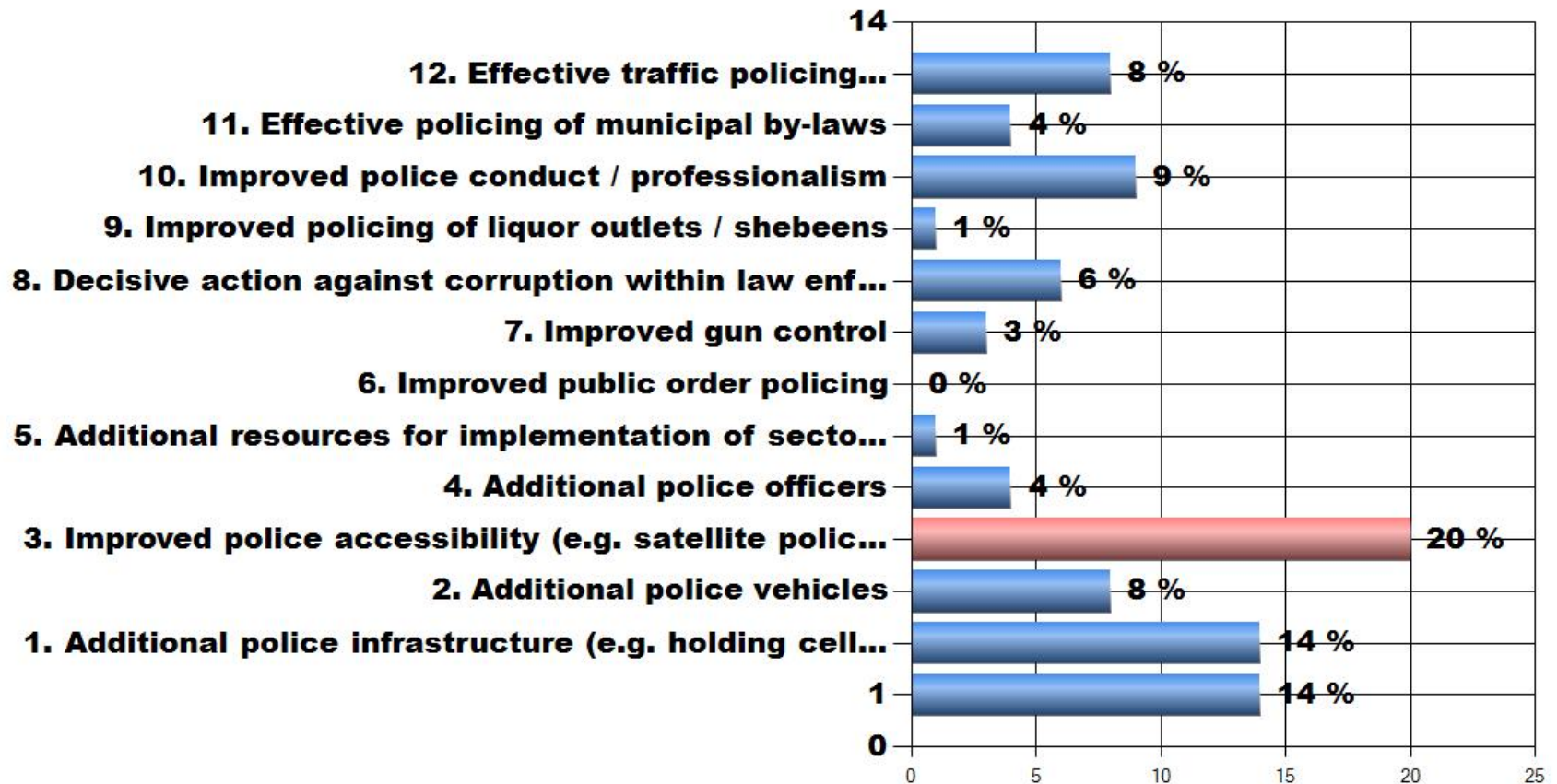

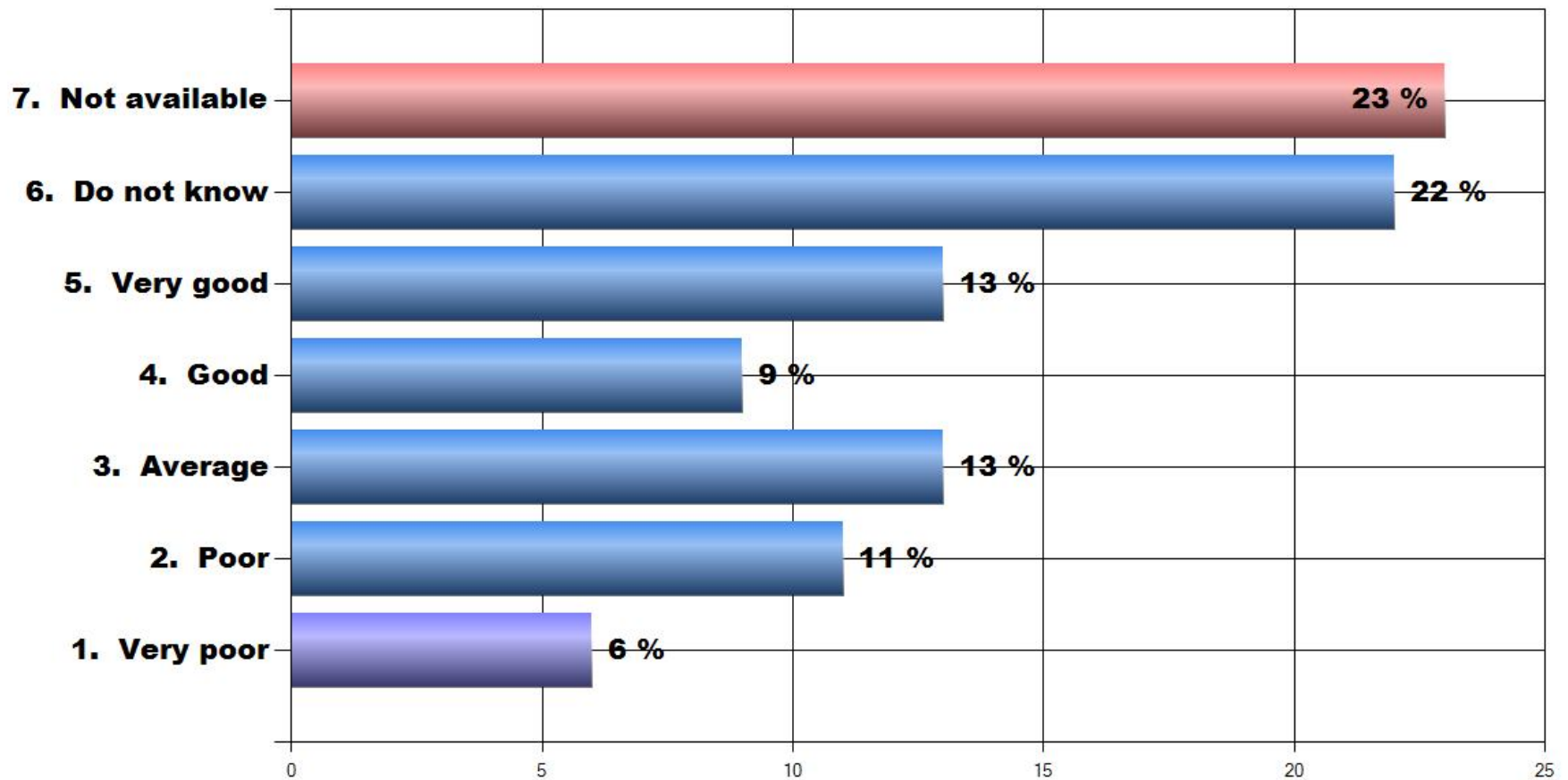

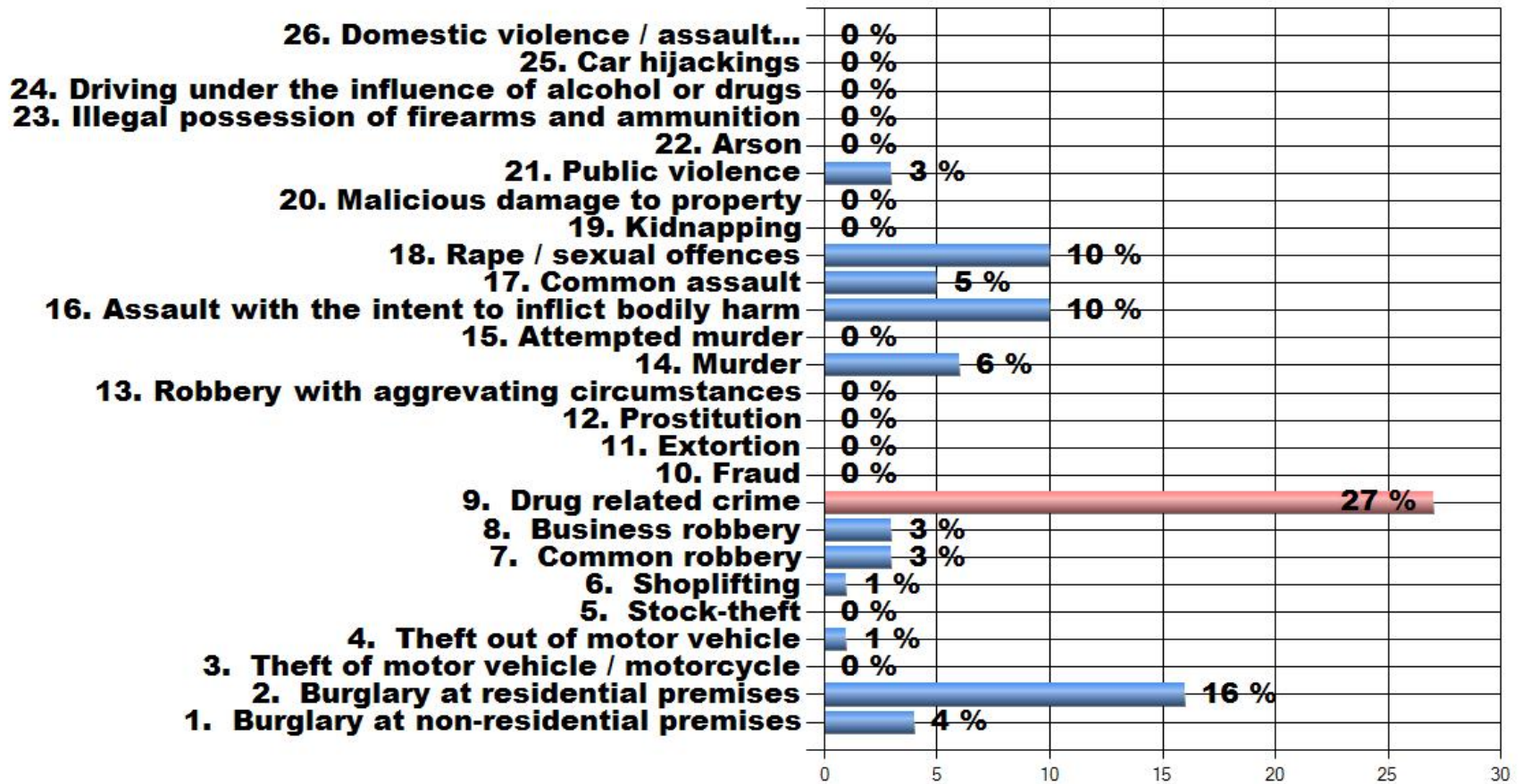

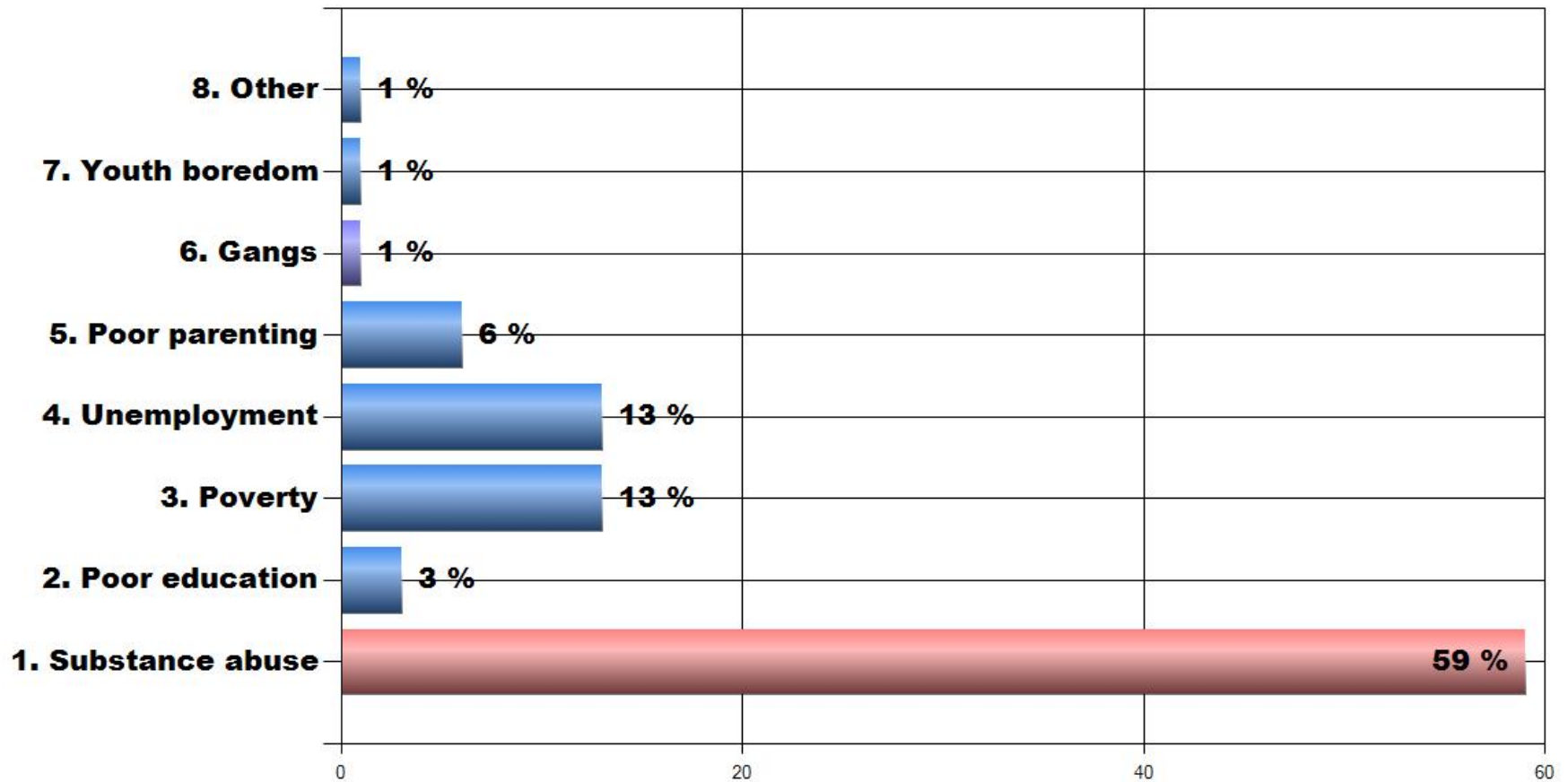

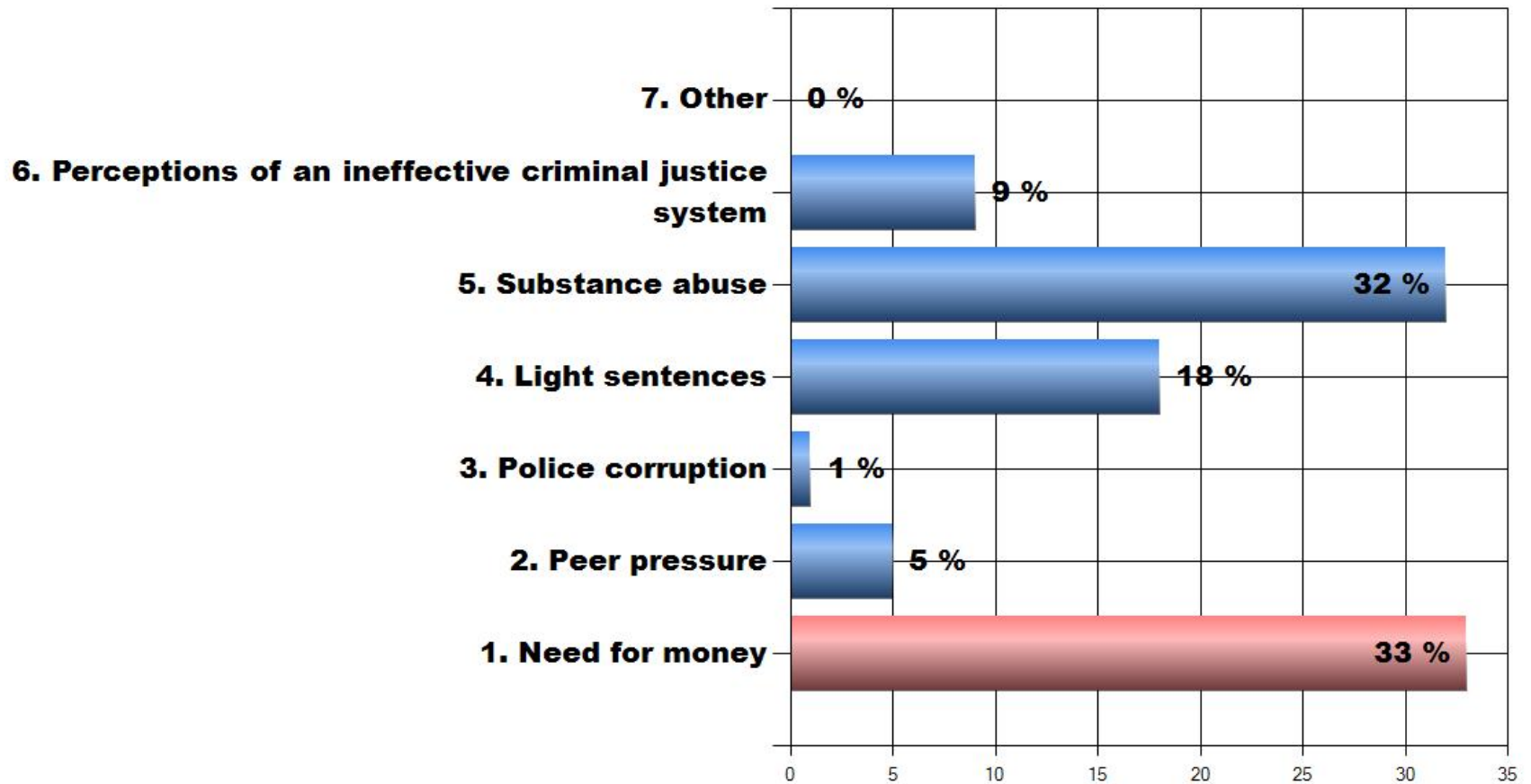

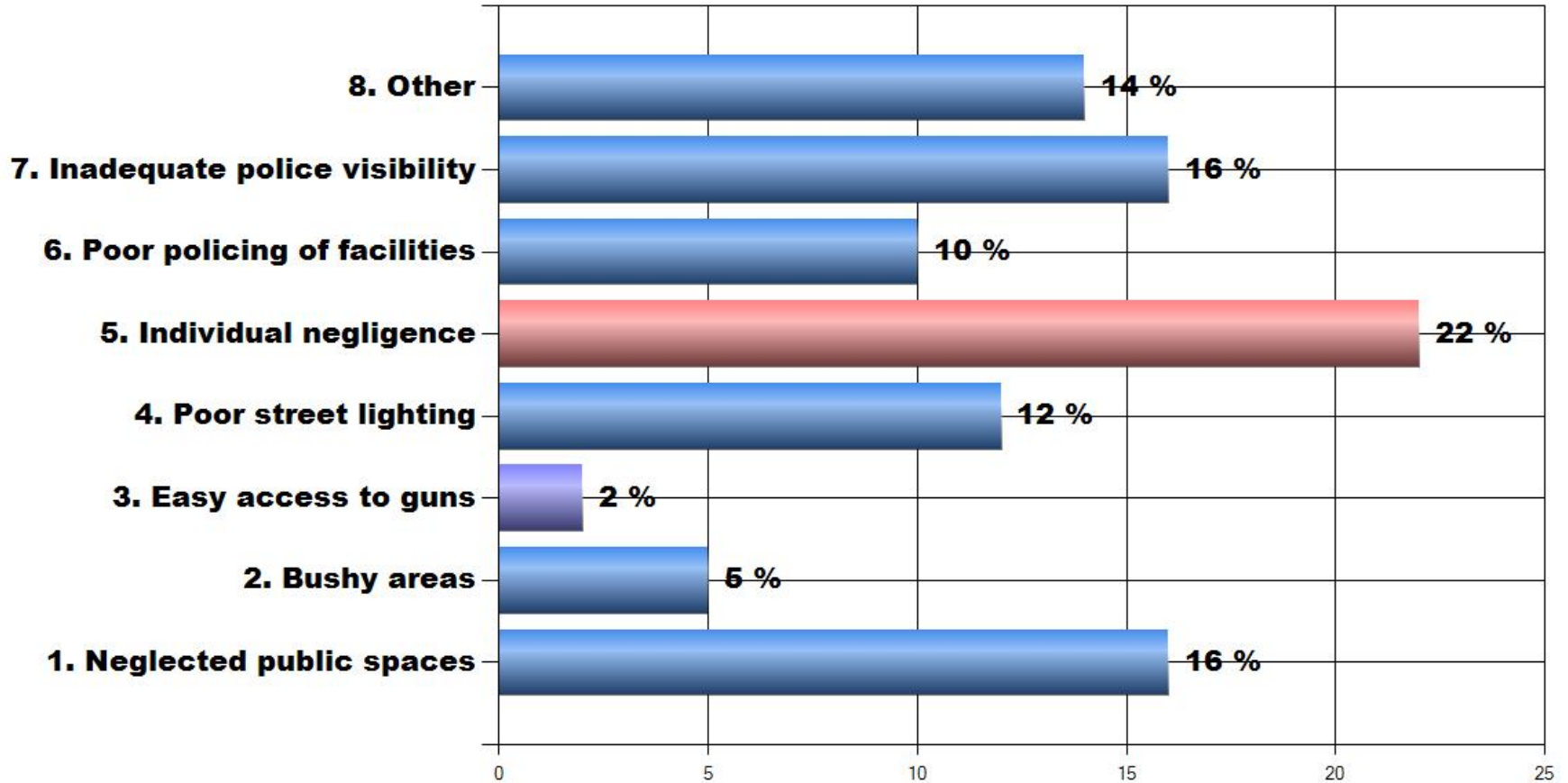

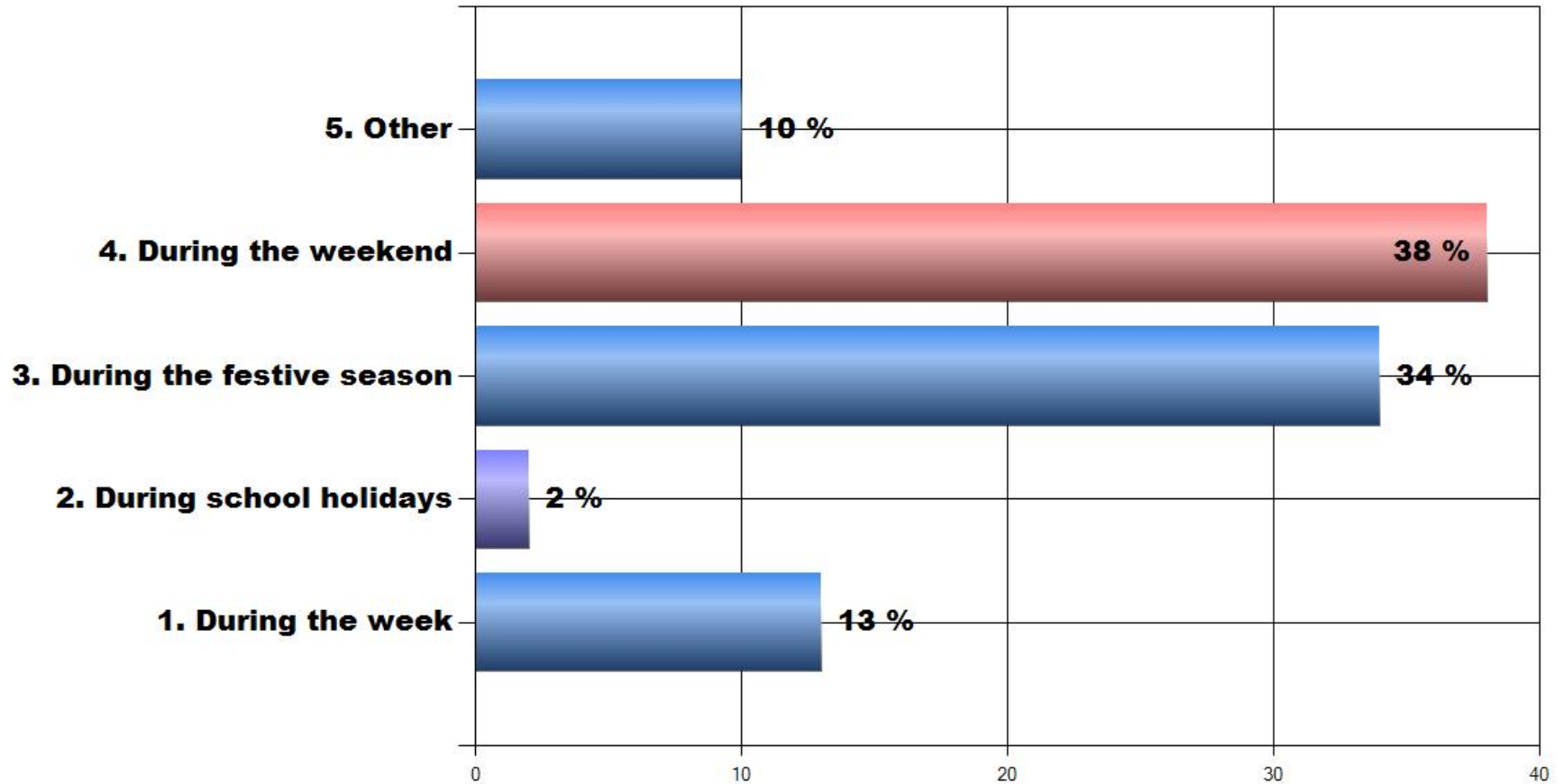

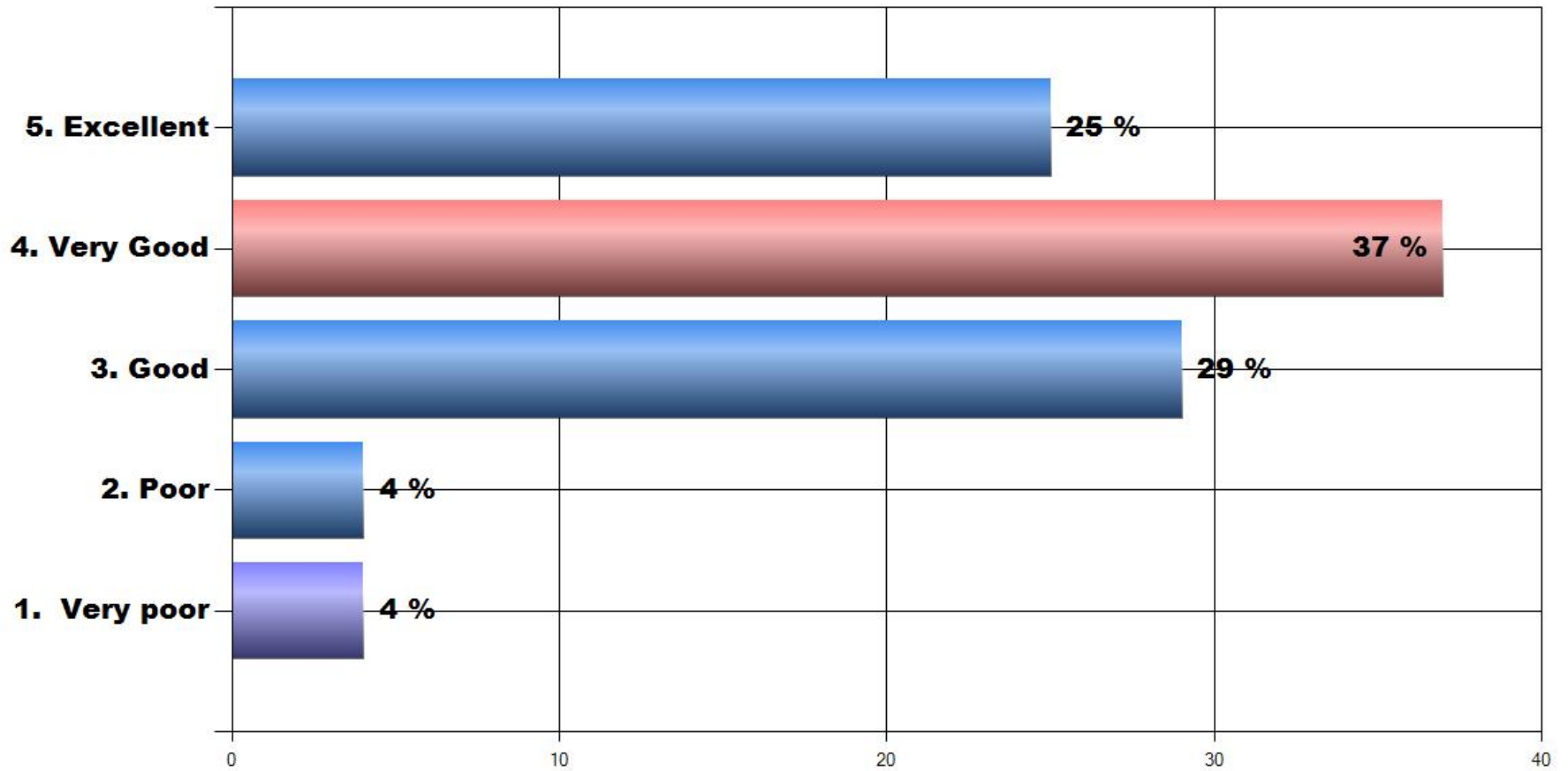
