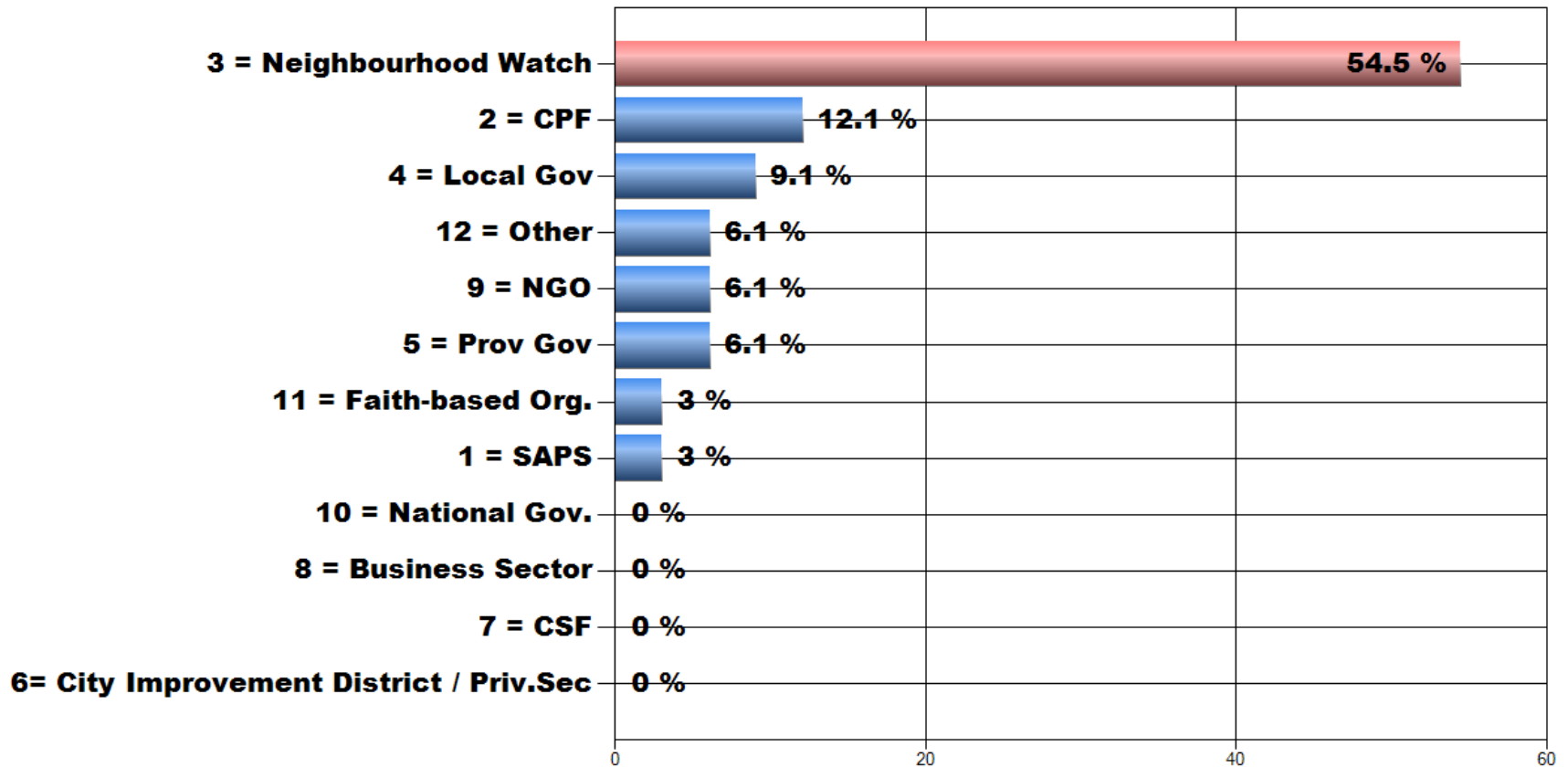
# METHODOLOGY

- Demographic data included

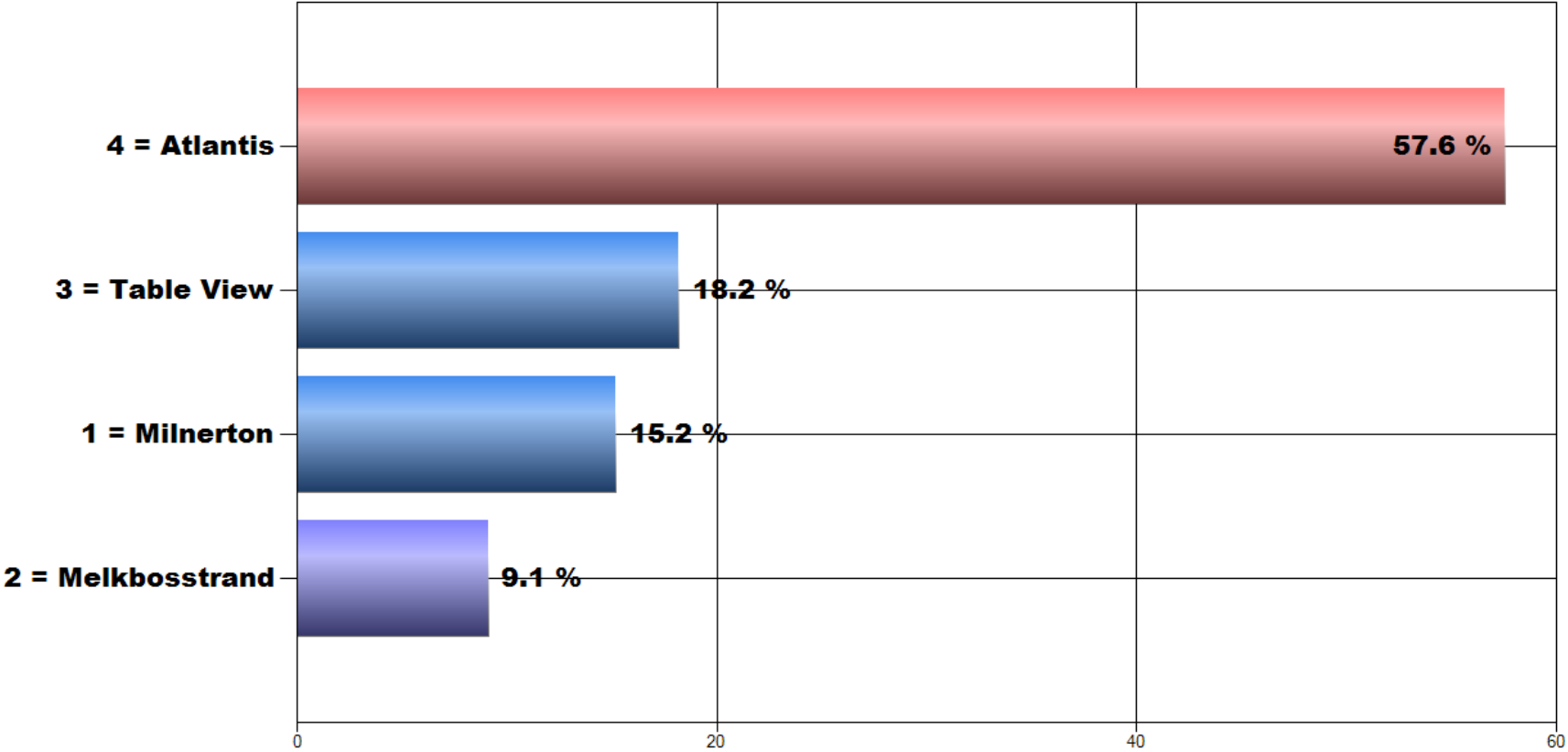

Stakeholder information [33 voters]



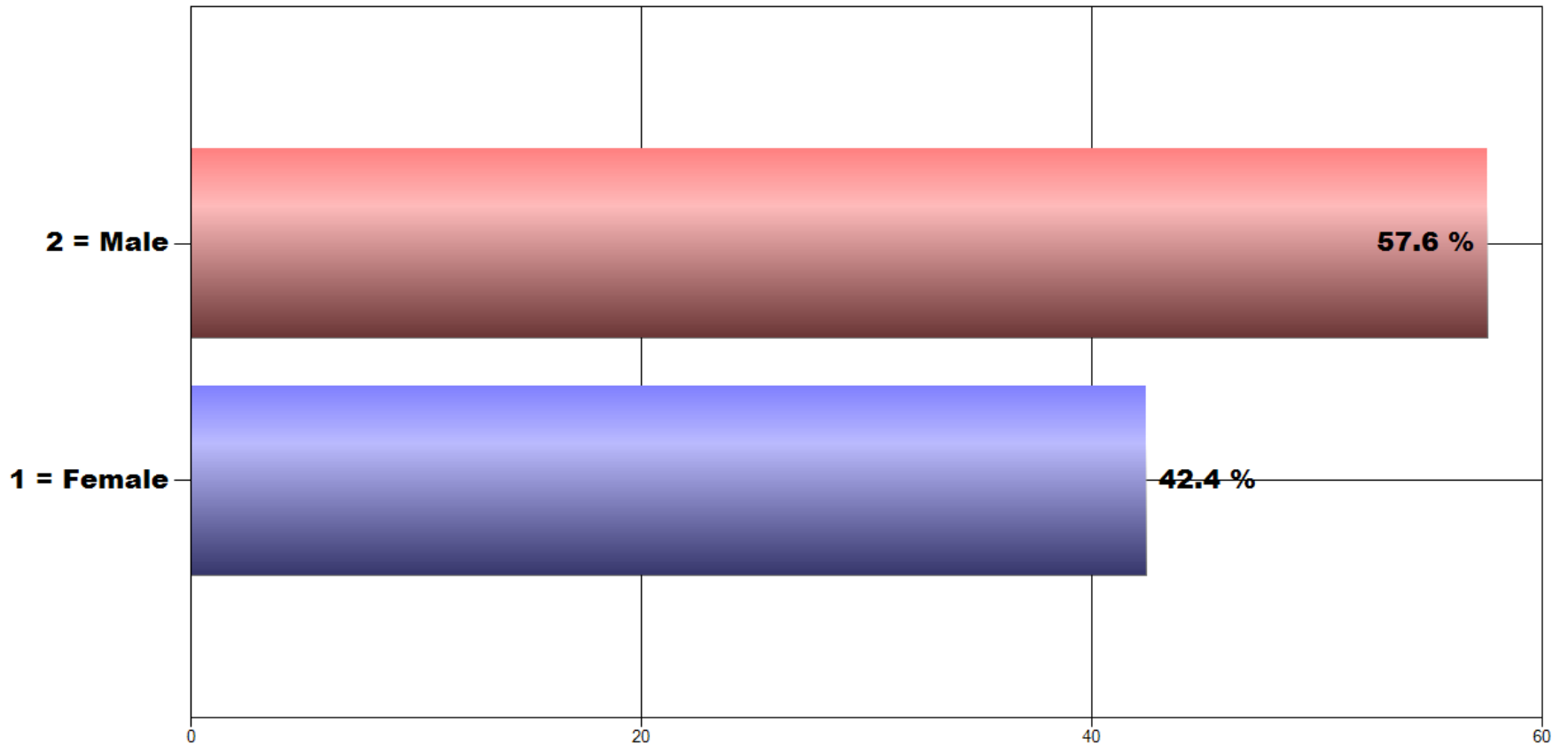
# REPRESENTATION PER PRECINCT

Police station or Precinct [33 voters]

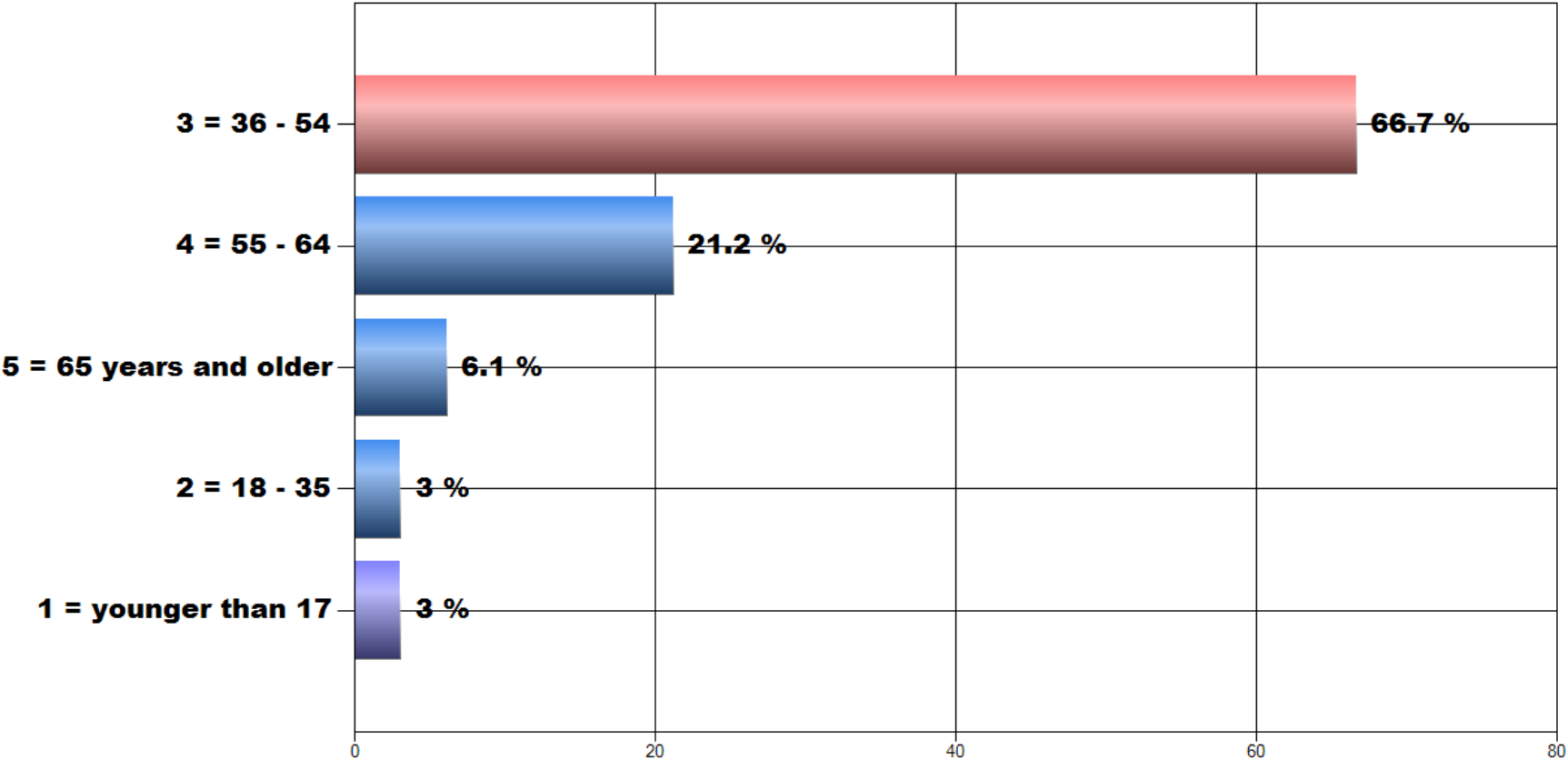

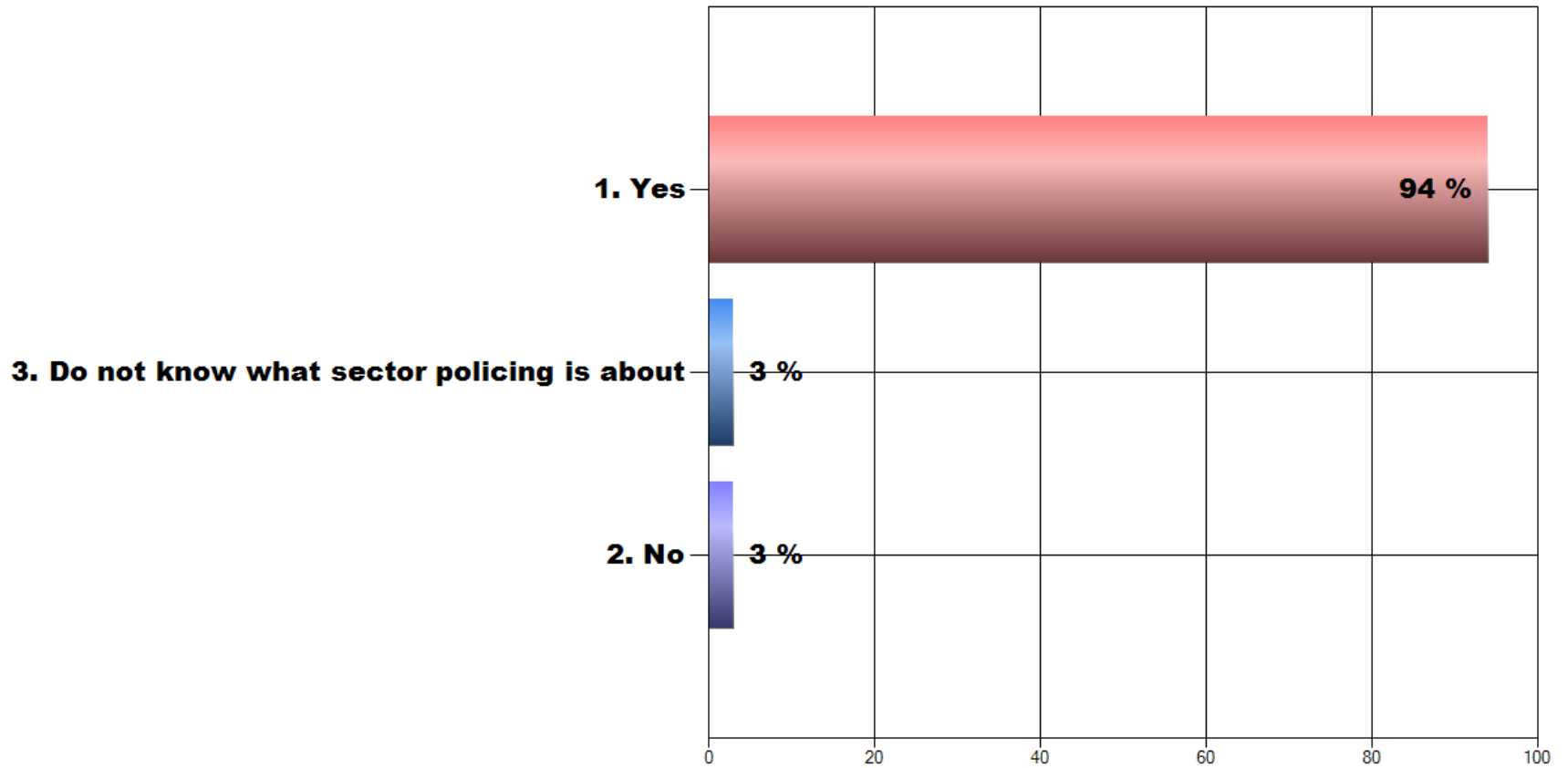

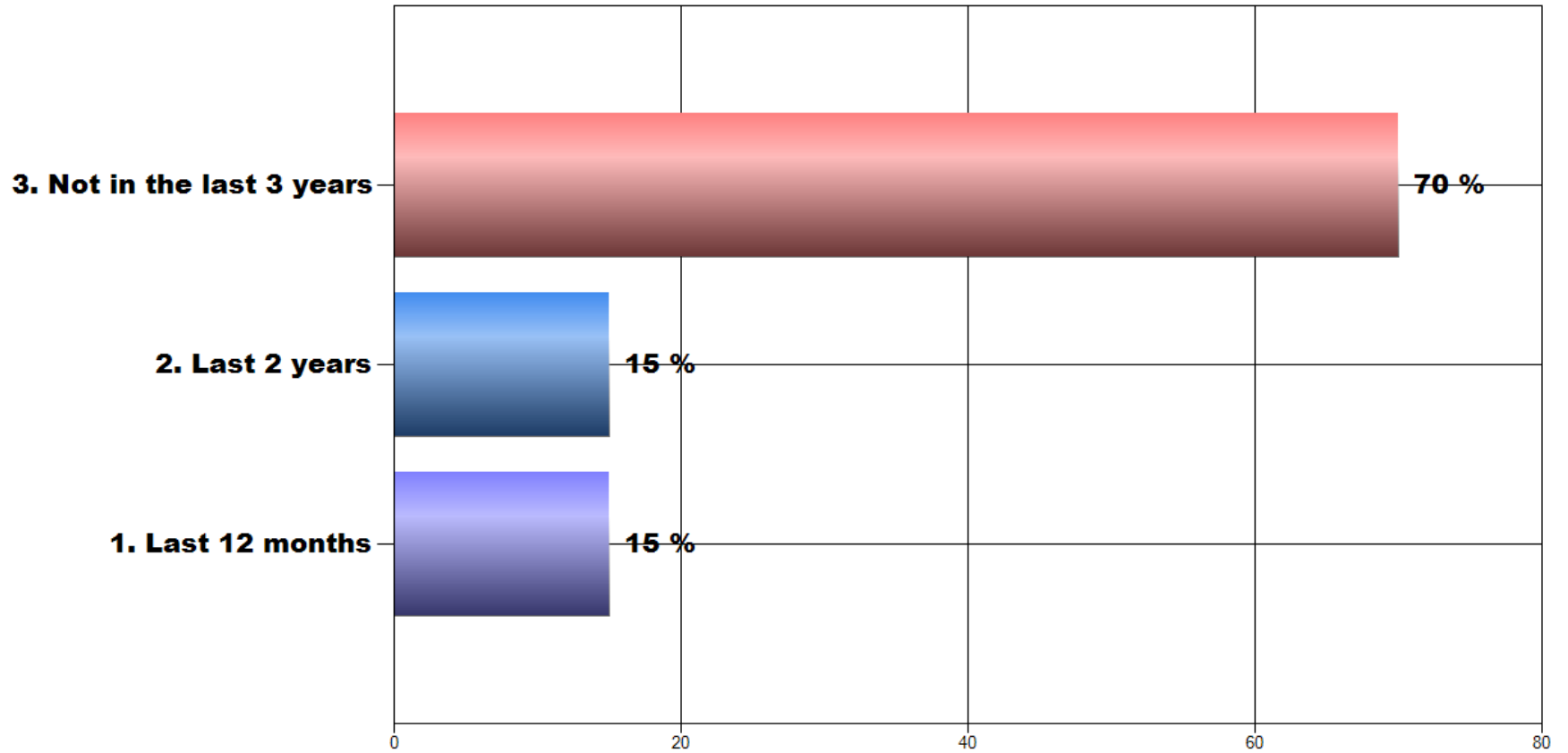

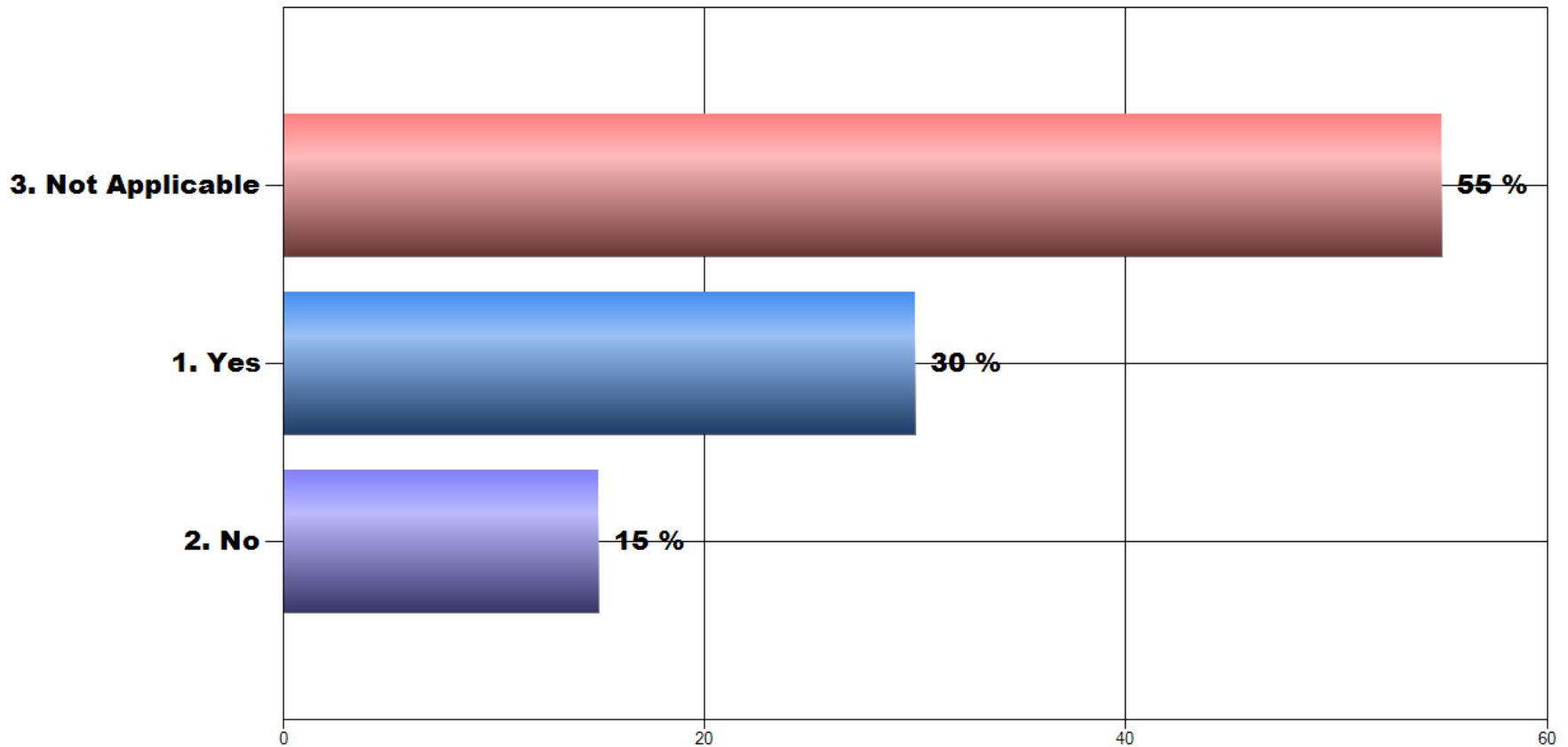

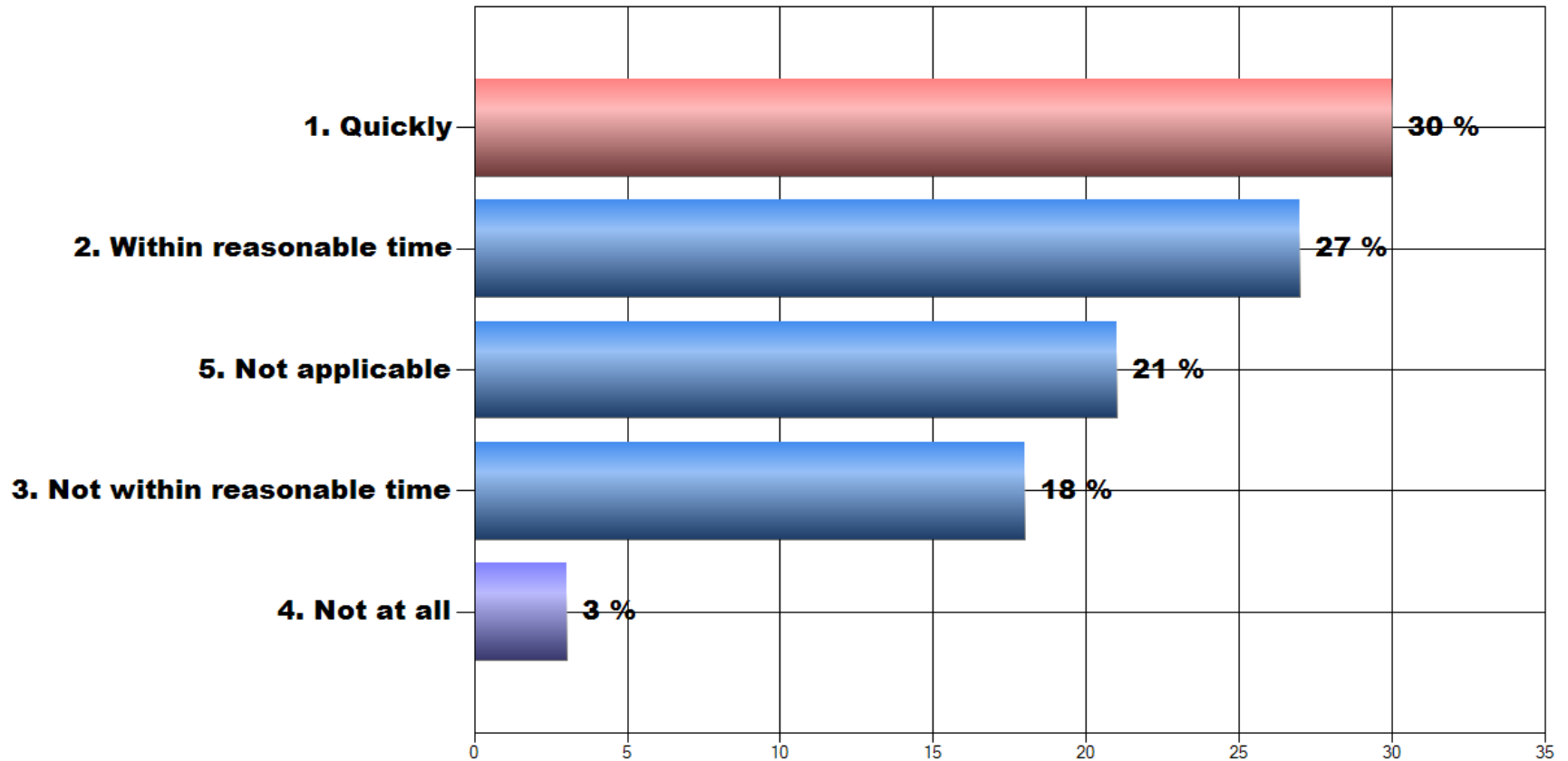




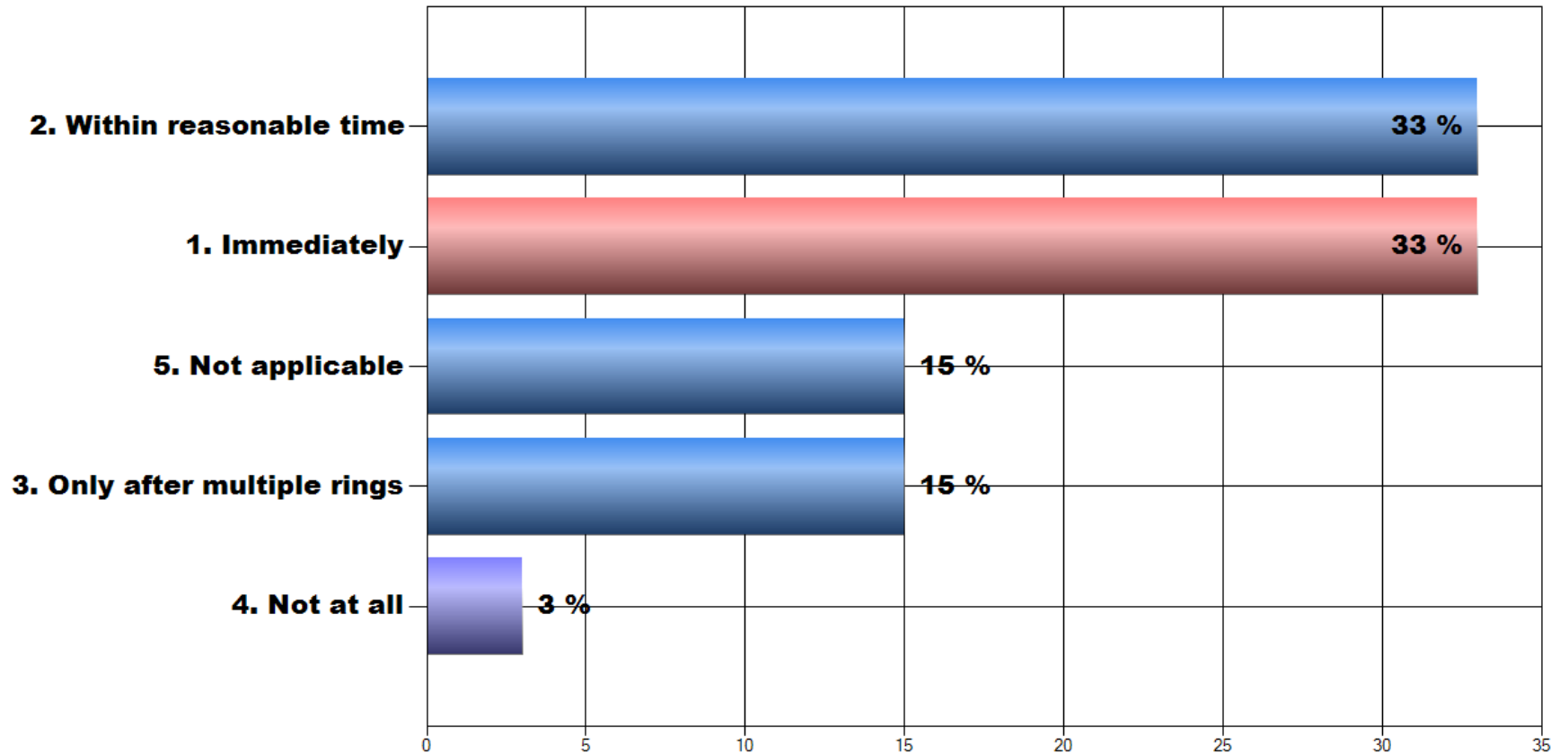

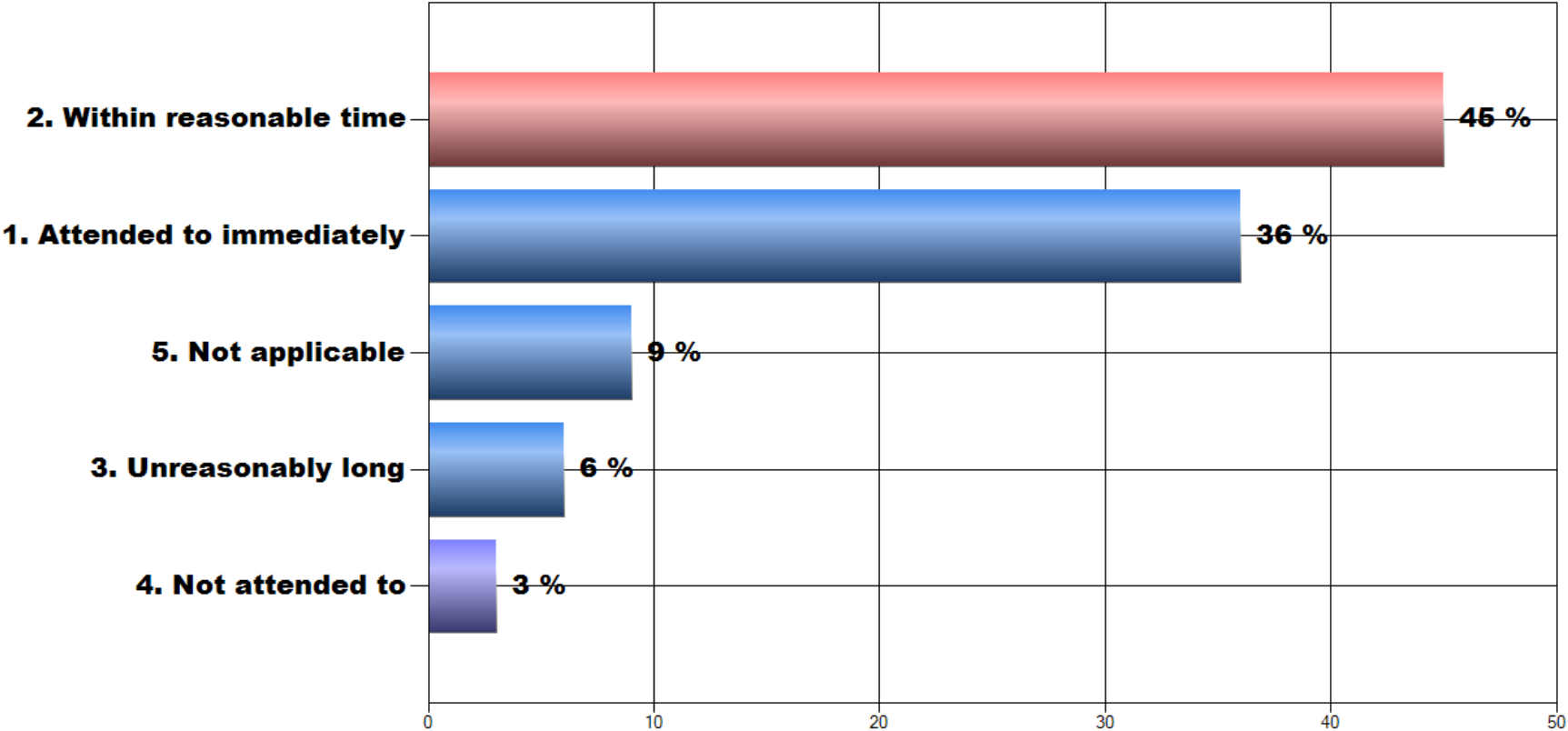

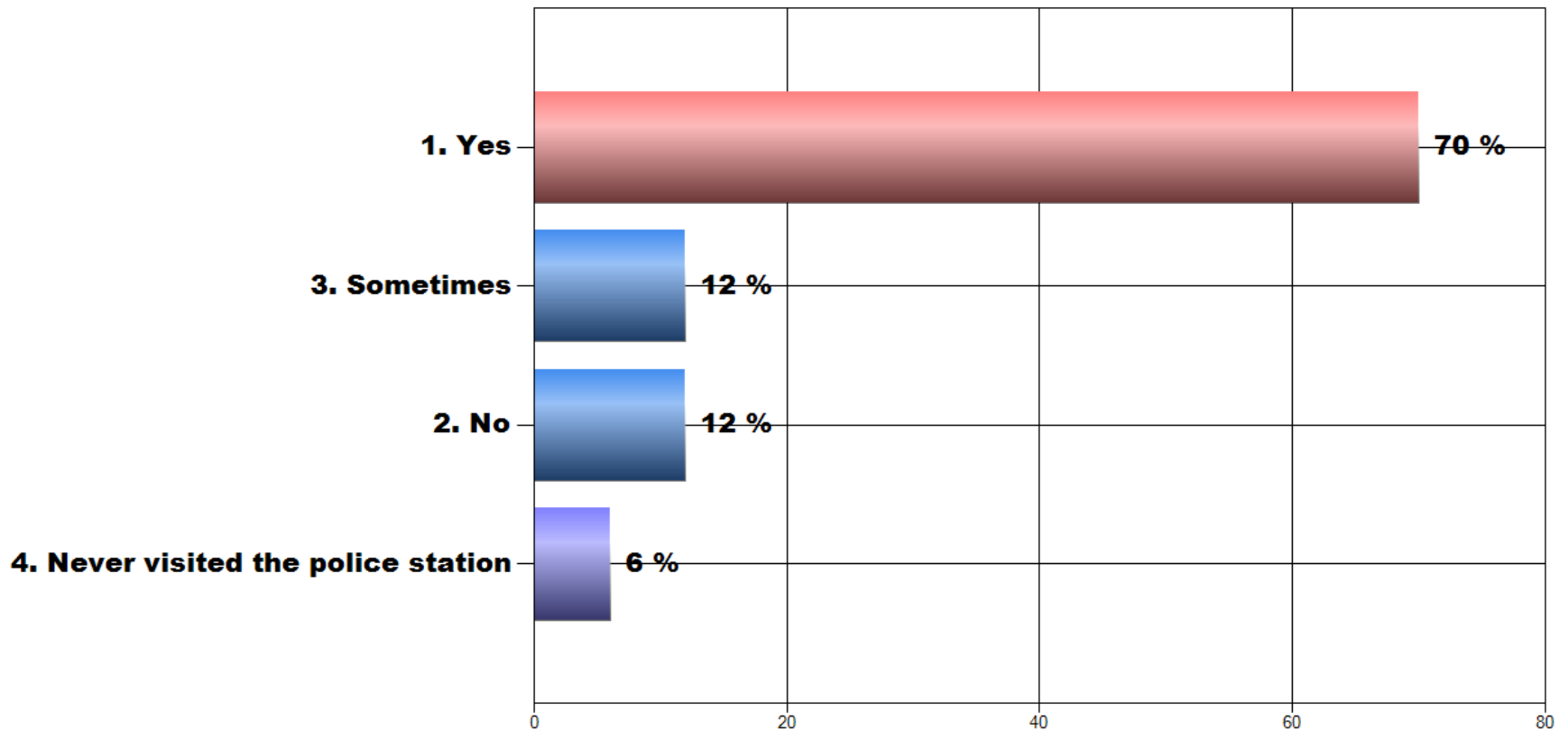

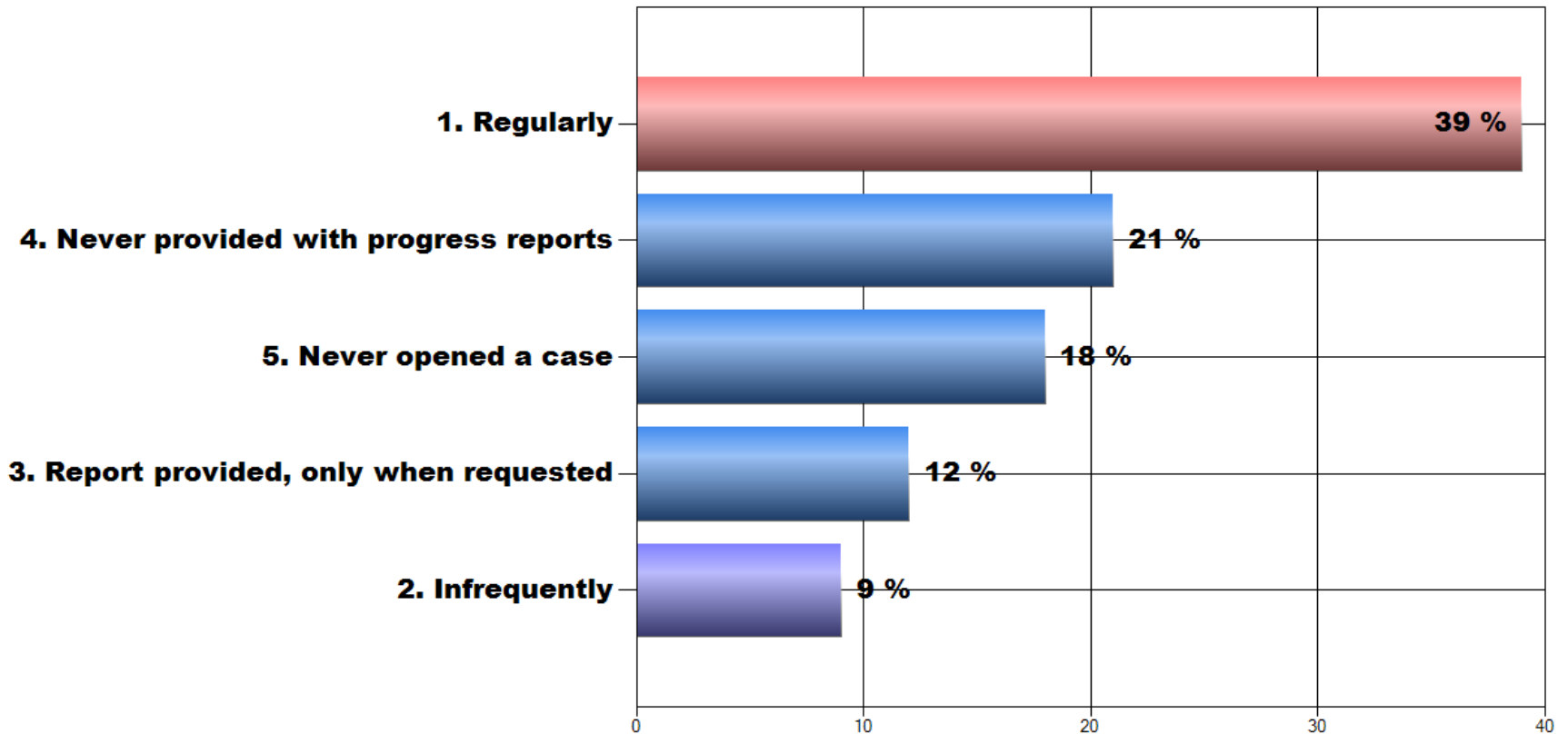

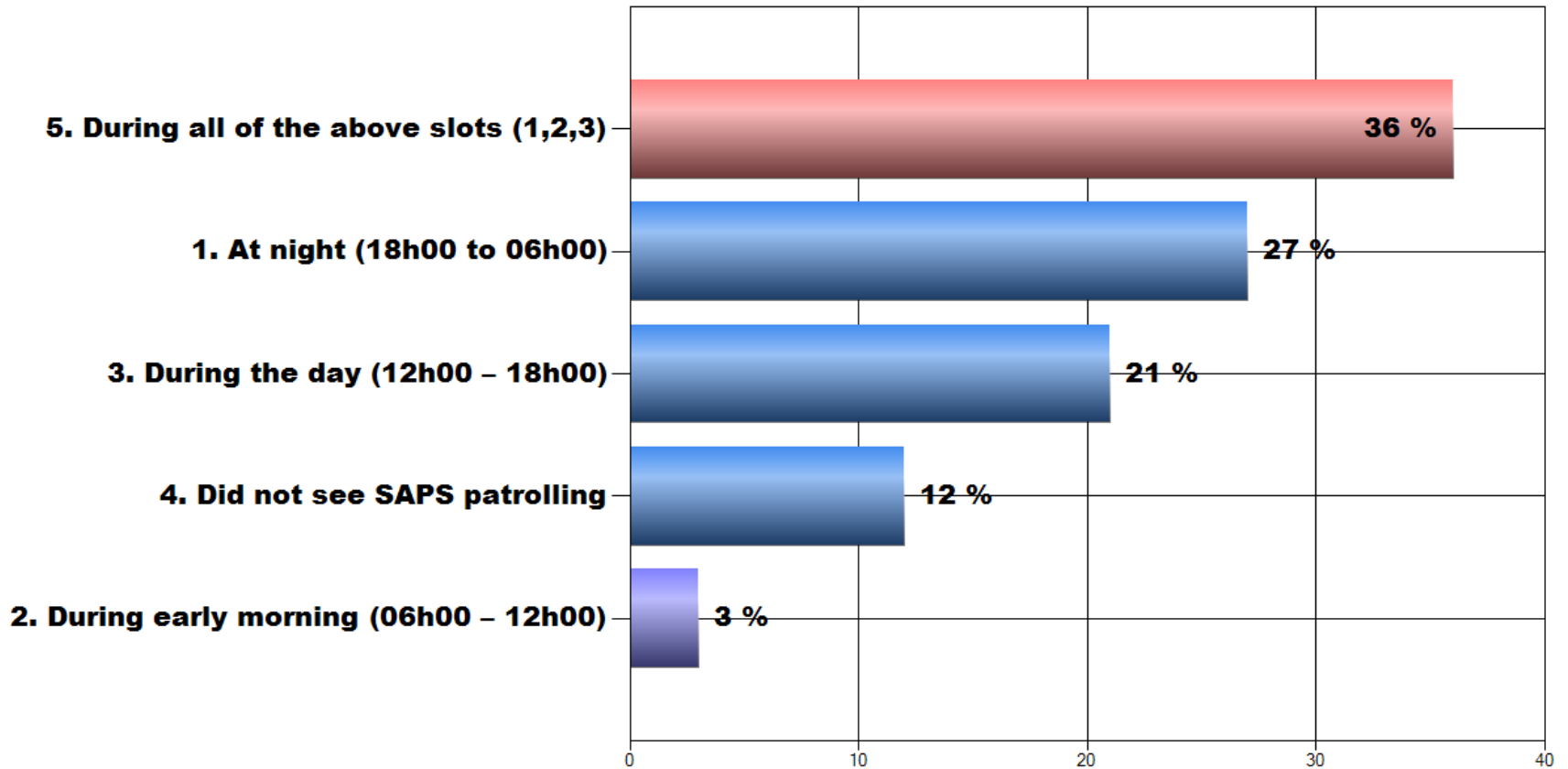

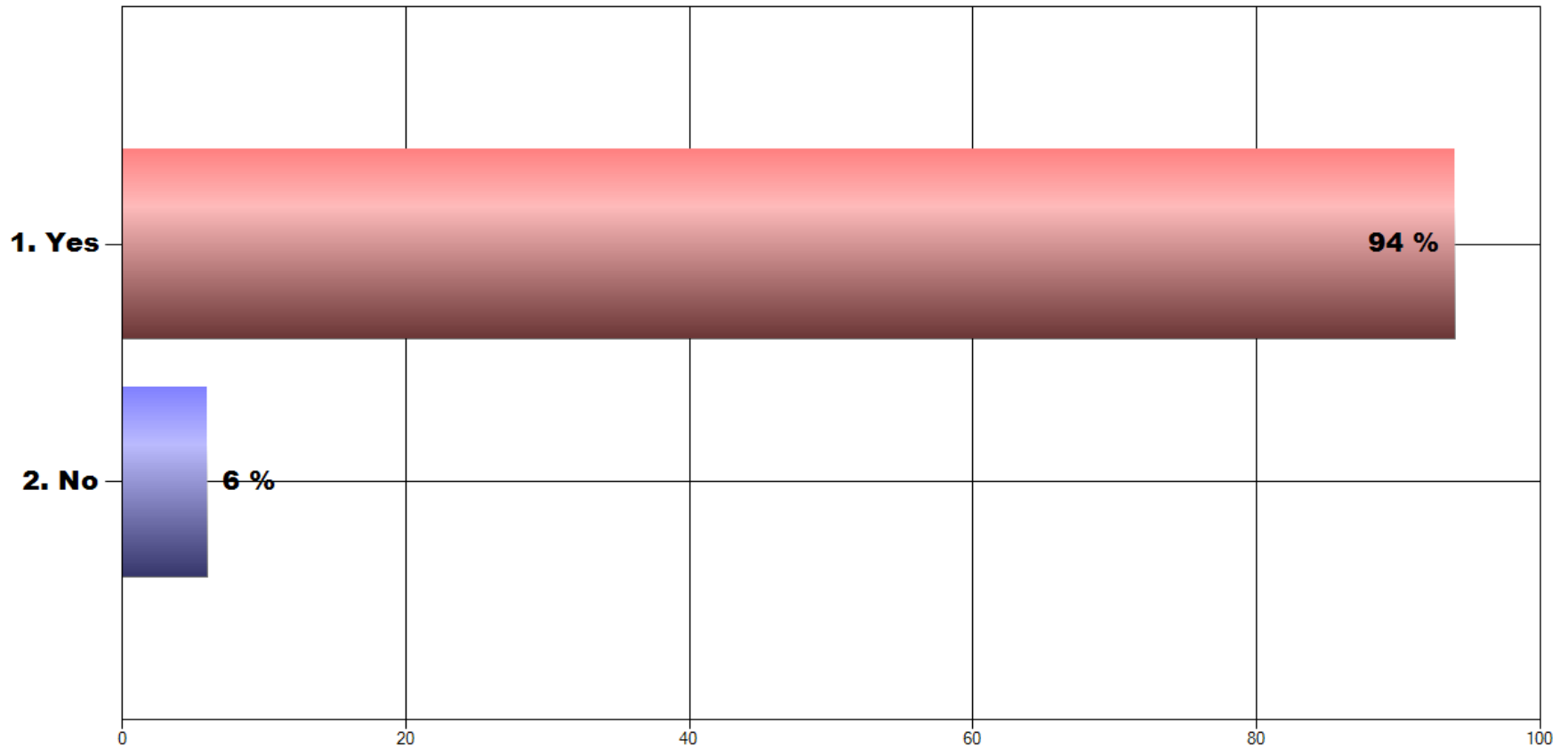

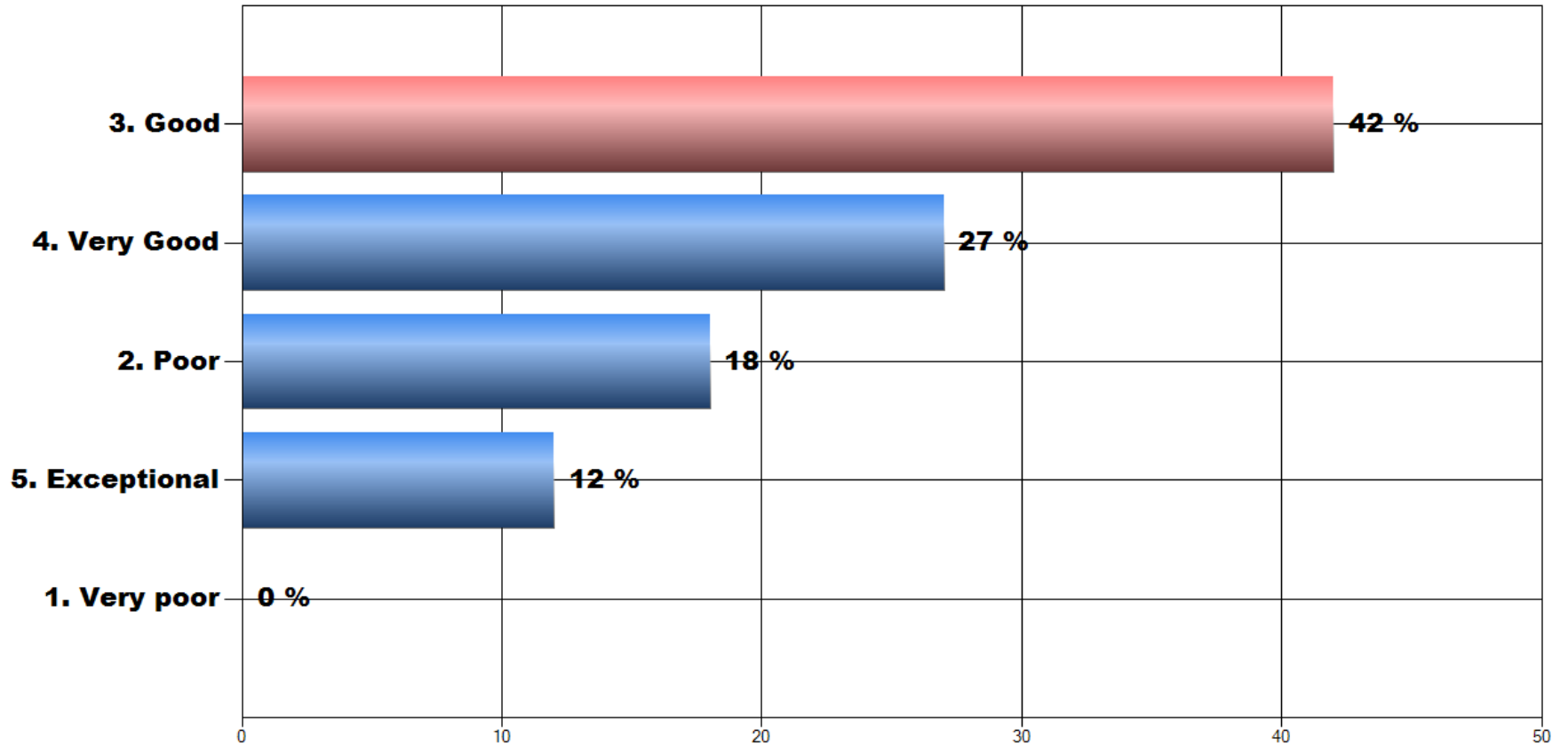

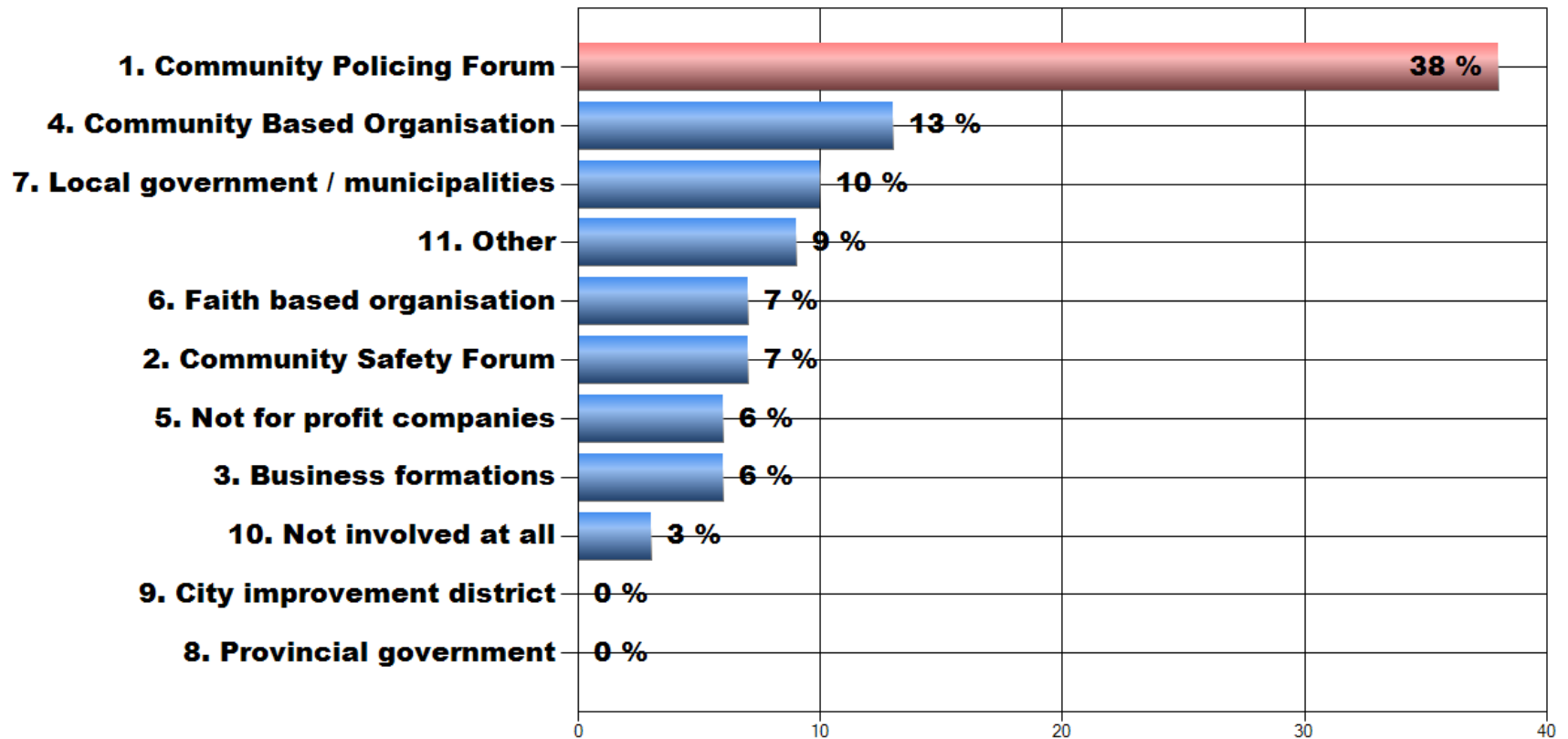

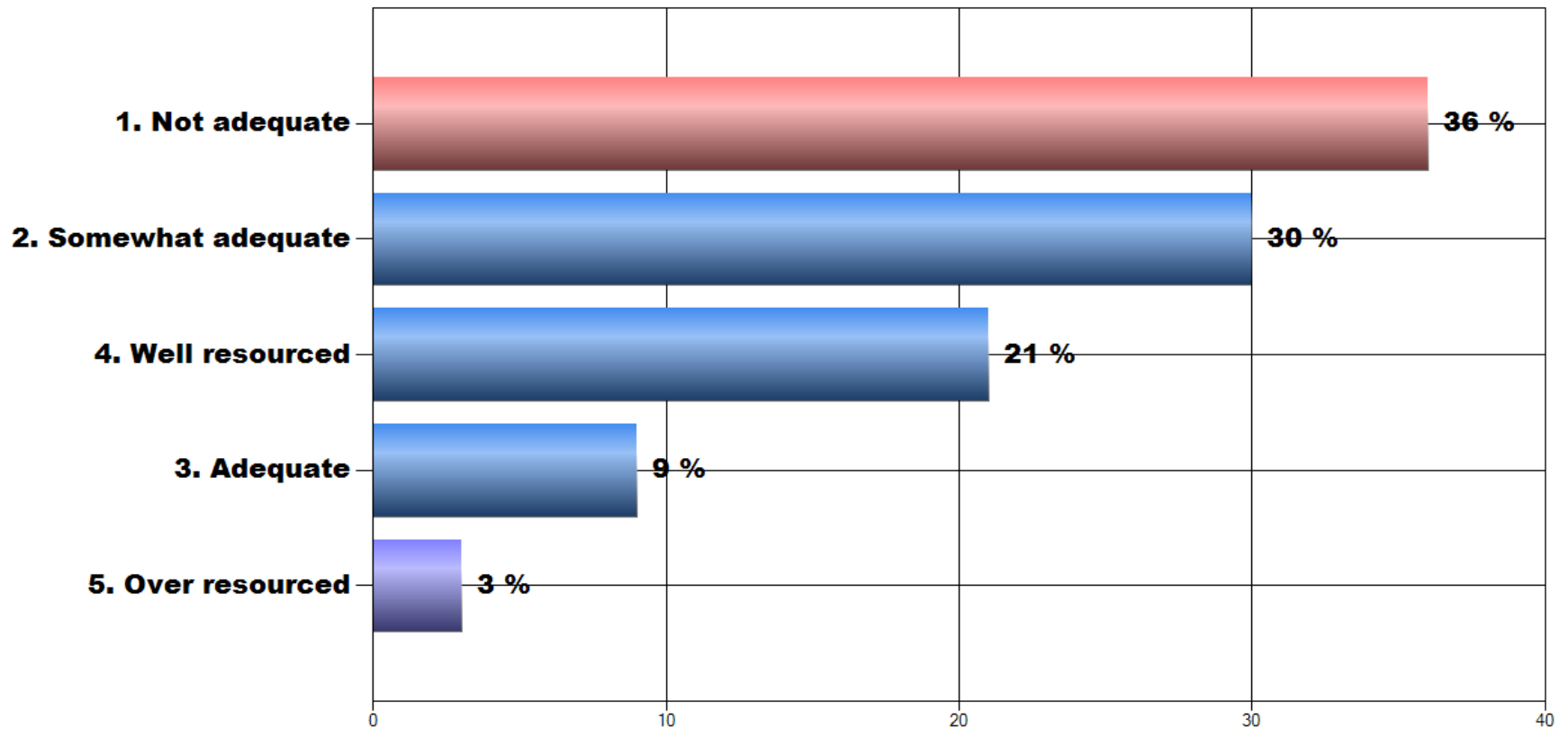

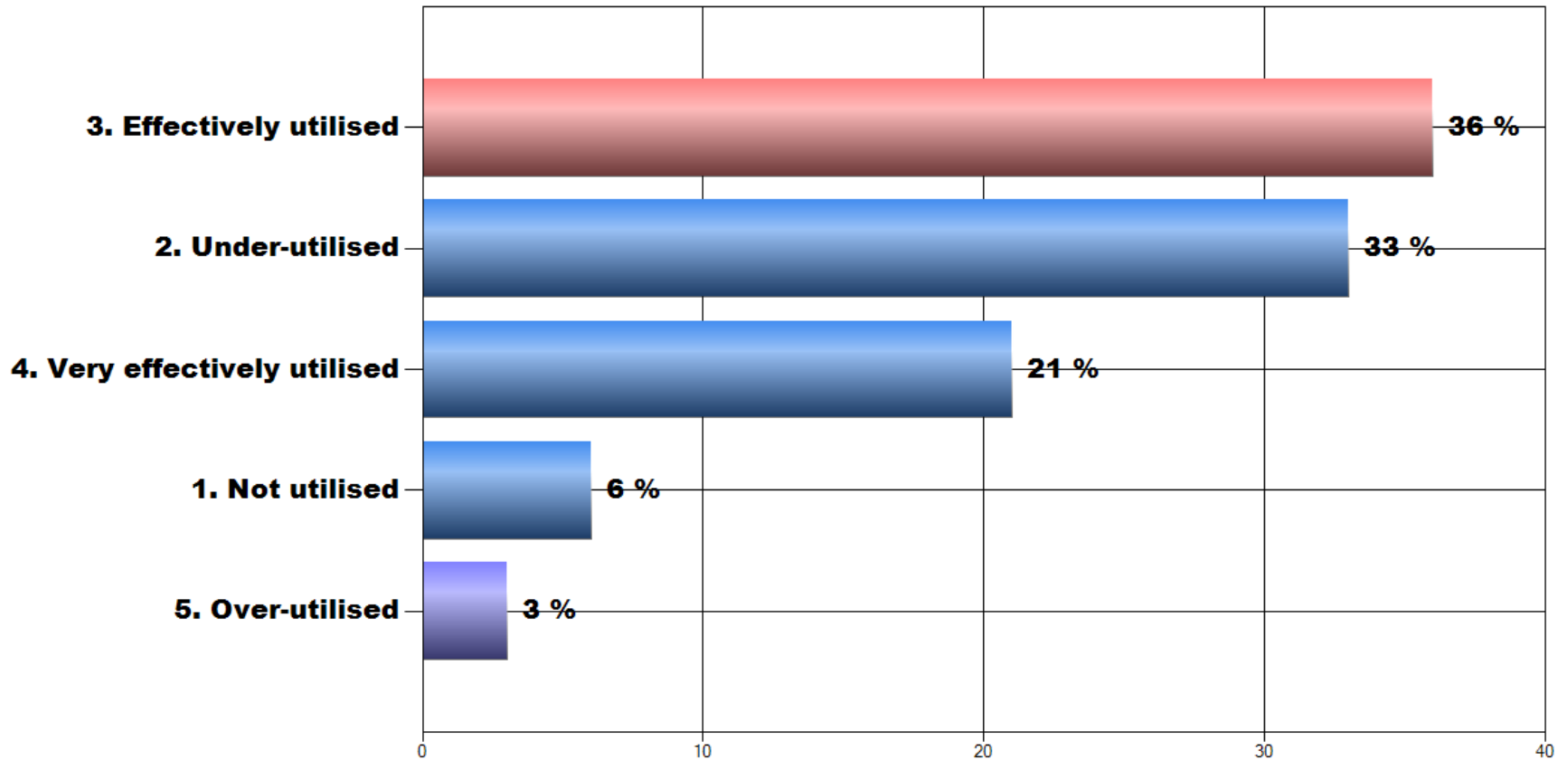

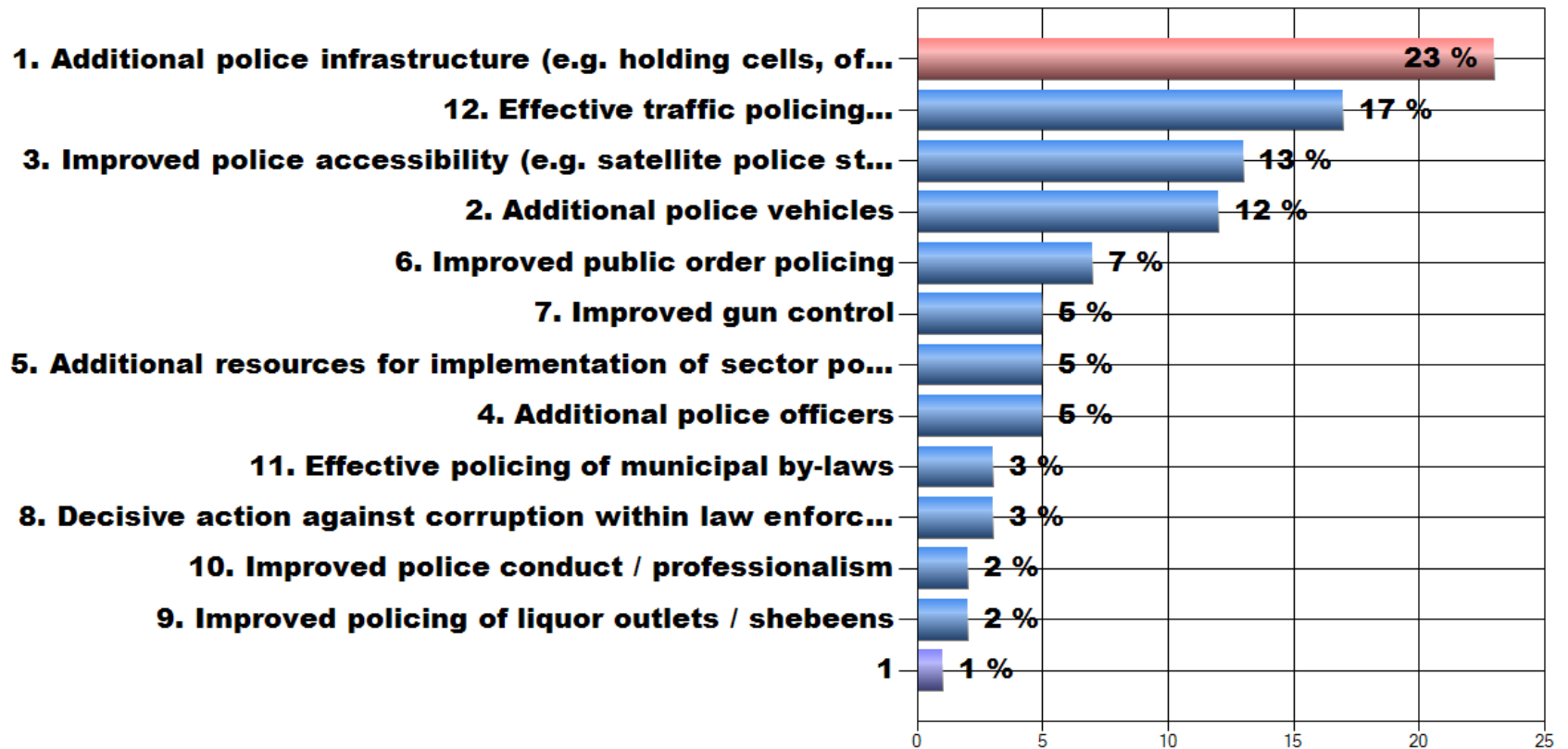

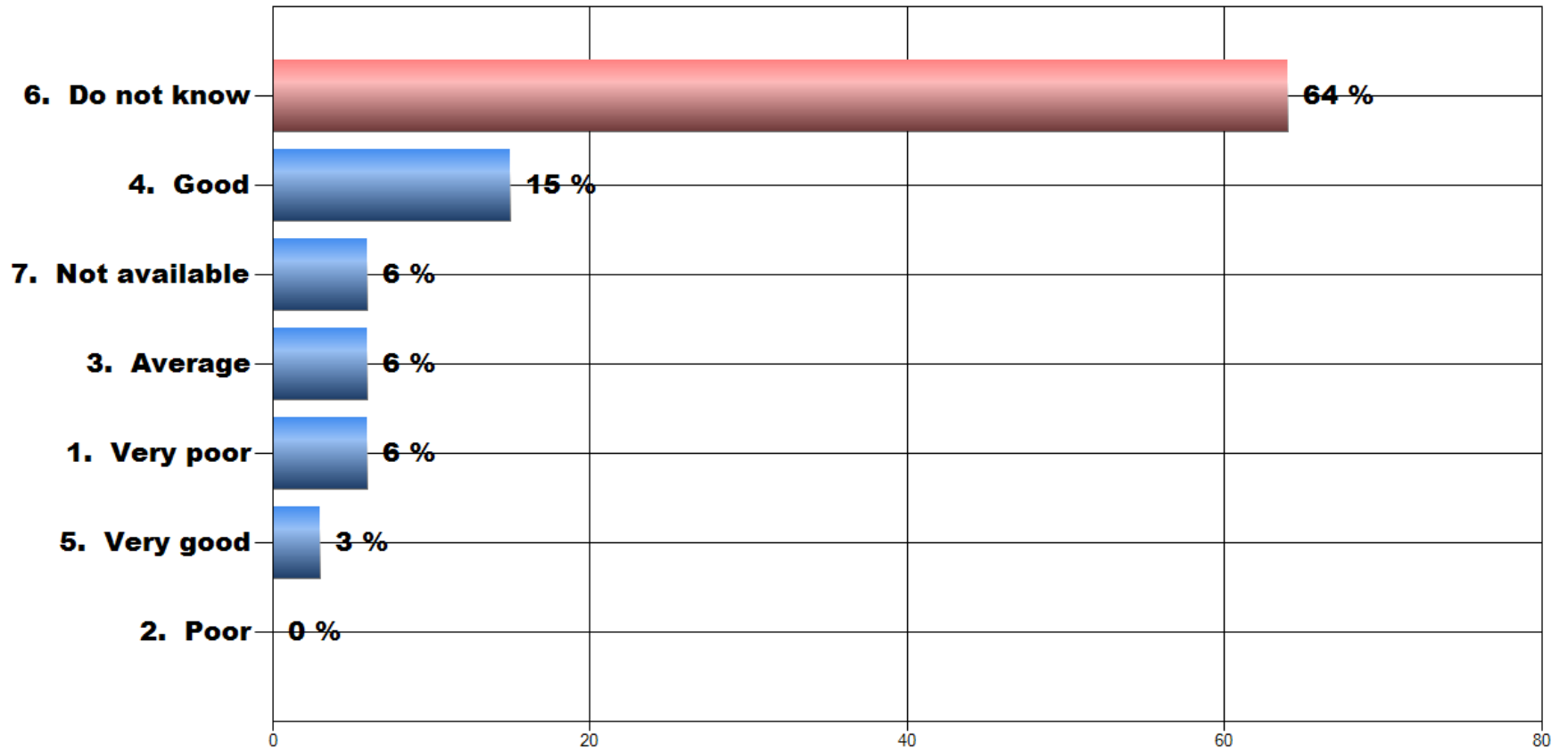

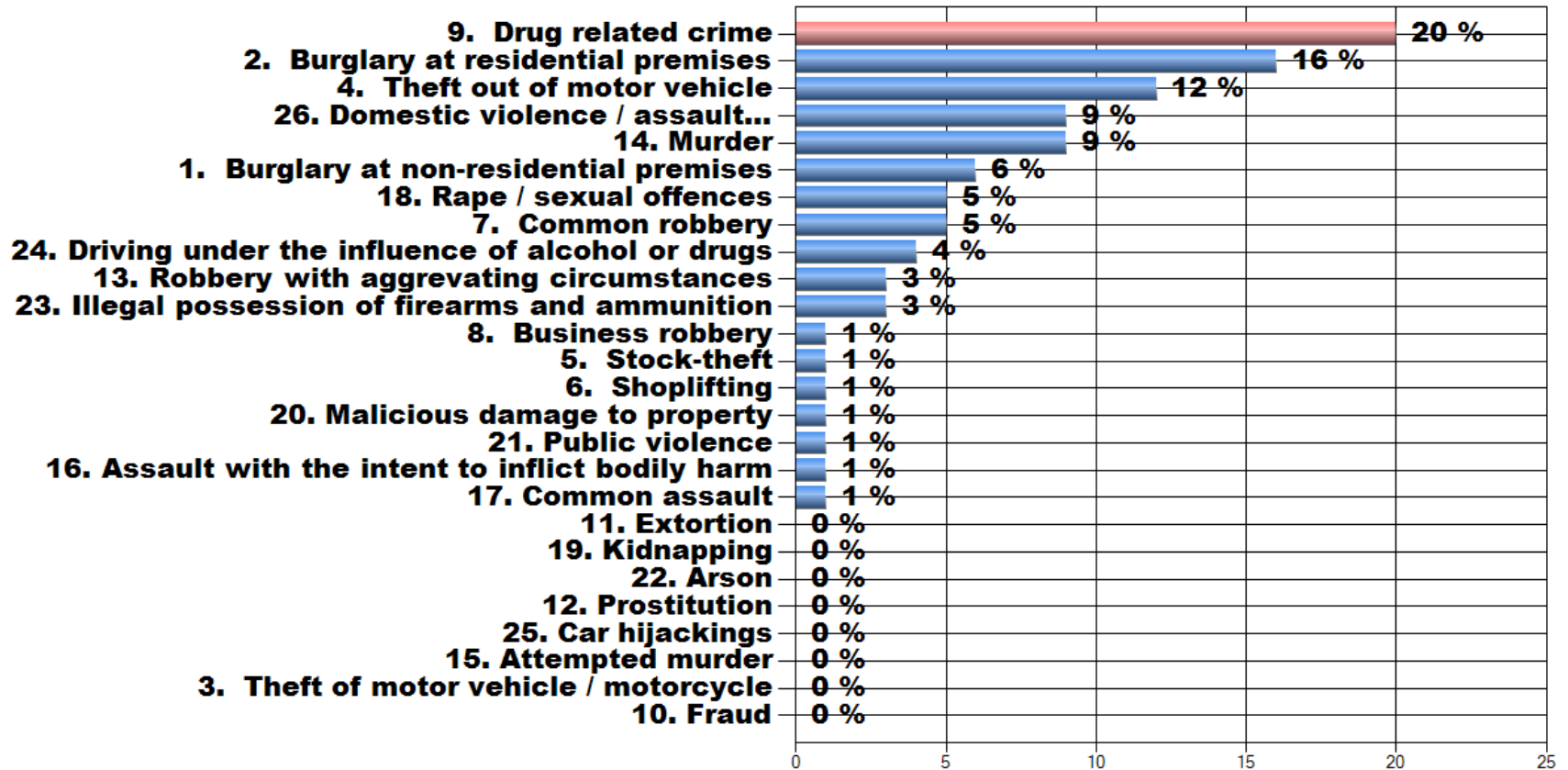
