

# **METHODOLOGY**


- Data collection: Crowd sourcing technology

- Both the number of respondents and the percentage are reflected in the graph









#### 20. In your opinion, what is the main contributor of crime? (possible causes) (Item 20 of 28) [Votes = 45]






21. In your opinion, what is the main motivator of crime? (Item 21 of 28) [Votes = 45]






22. In your opinion, what is the main oppportunity for crime in your area? (Item 22 of 28) [Votes = 44]






