

4. CLASSIFICATION OF HOSPITALS, CLINICS AND PATIENTS FOR TARIFF PURPOSES

4.2 Clinics

4.2.1 According to services rendered clinics are classified as follows:

4.2.1.1 Day hospitals and community health care centres.

4.2.1.2 Primary health care centres and clinics.

4.2.1.3 Mobile clinics and part-time clinics.

4.2.1.4 Home visits.

Note:

- (i) Day hospitals, community health care centres, primary health care centres, clinics, mobile clinics and part-time clinics which are situated in the Metropole area fall mostly under the control of the Community Health Services-organisation (Woodstock).
- (ii) Clinics in the rural areas fall under the control of the relevant hospitals nearest to them.

4.3 Patients

4.3.1 Patients are only classified as single or family units. A family unit includes a couple, a single parent or a single person with a dependant. Please note that a widow or widower with dependants is regarded as a family unit and without dependants is regarded as a single person.

4.3.2 Patients are classified according to a means test which is based on the declared gross family income or, in the case of patients whose income is difficult to establish, on their total assets. Patients are classified into three groups, namely HOSPITAL PATIENTS, PRIVATE HOSPITAL PATIENTS and PRIVATE PATIENTS.
