
Thepurposeofthemeetingistoreportbackonthe issuesofthelast meeting.

4. STATUSREPORTS

4,1. IMPLEMENTATIONANDFINALISATIONOFTHEINSTITUTIONAL FRAMEWORK

The Urban Renewal Structure was shown on an overhead and is illustrated below:



The Political Champions component of the structure has been established and is meeting on amonthly basis with the curre name eting being the third meeting.

TheMultistakeholdersteeringcommitteehasmetinAprilandis progressingverywell.

WithrespecttotheURPunit,meetingshavebeenheldwiththeHuman ResourcesDepartmentoftheCityandphaseoneoftheunitsh ouldbein placebythe30 thMay.

Theinitialpositionswillbeadvertisedinternallyastherearesufficient skillswithintheCityofCapeTown.

TheMitchellsPlainandKhayelitshaSteeringCommitteesarecurrently runningwiththeQuickwinprojectsin bothareas.

The Mitchells Plain and Khayelitsha Forahave been established and are involved in planning and the initiation of projects.

ThelastboxwhichincludesCommunityinvolvementneedstobeensured. Howisthecommunityinvolved, whataretheben efitstothecommunity andhowisthe "soft" development being dealt with and how is it progressing.

The MPDF outlined how they have structured their organization to ensure maximum community involvement through the setting upof five strategies or sector swhich each include a number of sub-sectors.

Thesegroupsmeetonaregularbasisandcomprisecommunity organizationsandrepresentativesandareconvenedviatheExecutiveof theMPDFandstrategyheads.

Aplenarymeetinghasbeenscheduledfortheend of April, which will enable input from the various sectors.

The MPDF also has representation on the Multi -stakeholder Steering Committee.

TheissuewasraisedwhichNationalandProvincialDepartmentsare representedontheMulti -StakeholderSteeringComm ittee. AllDepartmentswithinvolvementinUrbanRenewalshouldbe representedwithinthisstructure.

Itwasrespondedthattheintentionwastokeepthisstructuresteam -lined andtheDepartmentswhosepresencewasrequiredshouldattendasand whenrequi red.

The Urban Renewal Forum has all National Departments represented and meets once amonth with the attendance of the Nodal Local Authorities as well as the coordinating Provincial Government Departments.

Thequestionwasraisedwhethernationalcoordi nationmeetingswere heldpriortotheNationalUrbanRenewalForummeetingstoensurethe coordinationofeveryDepartmentintheprogram. IsthishappeningateverylevelofGovernmenttoensureeffective coordination?

DPLGcoordinatesataNationallev elviatheURForum,whichhasmet twicethisyear.

Anationalworkplanisintheprocessofbeingfinalizedwhichwillguide theinvolvementofthevariousDepartmentswithrespecttotheir involvementintheprogram.

The Province is represented on the Steering Committee and all Departments are coordinated via the IDP Coordinating Committee, which deals with the URP rogram, the IDP's, the ISRP'S and the Provincial Strategic Development Program.

ThepointofentryintotheProvinceisviatheDepartment ofLocal Government.

ProjectspecificrelationshipsaredirectlywiththeDepartmentconcerned.

WithrespecttotheCity,coordinationisdealtwithviatheMulti StakeholderSteeringCommittee.

Thereisarequirementforbettercoordination, which is cur rently being addressed.

Itwasconcludedthatcoordinationisacriticalissue, which requires constantatention from all levels of Governmentes pecially from an Inter Departmental point of view.

Itwasrequestedthatthislevelofcoordinationshouldb eoutlinedbythe threelevelsofGovernmentatthenextmeetingincludinghowthe communitybodiesareinvolvingthecommunityintheprogram.

ItwaspointedoutthattheCityshouldberesponsibletodriveand coordinatetheprogram.

4,2. QUICKWINPRO JECTSFORBOTHNODES

The "QuickWin" projects chedule and description was referred to in the documentation packattached to the Agenda. 70% of the seprojects are committed in terms of planning. Some of the "QuickWin's" are a continuation of existing projects.

There is an emphasis on the softer type of projects with respect to the allocation of the funding and the communities are involved with the implementation of these projects.

Therolesoftheofficialsandthecommunitymembershasbeenseto ut andtheprojectsarebeingsetupandimplementedthroughpartnership.

4.3. ANCHORPROJECTSFOR2003/2004FINANCIALYEAR

TheinitialsetofidentifiedAnchorProjectsforbothnodeswasreferredto inthedocumentationpackattachedtotheAgenda. FurtherworkisrequiredtofinalizethelistofAnchorProjectsandthese projectswillappearintheCity'sbudgetfor2003/2004,whichiscurrently beingfinalized.

ItwasrequestedthatthedescriptionoftheWolfgatAnchorProjectbe adjustedtoincl udetheterm, "integrationofMitchellsPlainwith Khayelitsha.

4,4. FUNDINGCOMMITMENTSFOR2003/2004FROMNATIONAL PROVINCIALANDCITY

The Citywa sunable to stipulate the budget allocations for the 2003/2004 budget as this budget is in the processo ffinalization. The Province is currently analyzing its budget complete budget allocation in order to accurately determine the projects of the various Provincial Departments within the two nodes.

This information will be made available as soon as it has been finalized which is expected to be the end of April 2003.

ItwasfurtherproposedthatthepoliticalchampionsoftheProvincemeet underthecoordinationoftheDepartmentofLocalGovernmenttoensure thattherearenoblockagesandtheinformatio nrelatingtotheprogramis appropriatelycirculated.

4,5. SUGGESTEDLAUNCHOFURPINJULY/AUGUST2003

AlaunchforUrbanRenewalwithinthetwonodeswaspropos edwhich needstobeattendedbythecommunitiesandthePresident.
Theremustbeidentifiableprogressandthepeopleonthegroundmustbe positiveabouttheprogram.

Itwasagreedthataplanbeproducedforthelaunchwithatargetplanand achievableandthatthisplanbeforwardedtothepoliticiansandtabledat thenextmeeting.

4.6. PROPOSALFORDONORFUNDING

FundingintheamountofR15millionhasbeenofferedbyAgence FrancoisedeDevelopmentProparco.

The National Government is encouraging local stakeholder mobilization with respect to the involvement of donors and the private sector.

FundersshouldunderstandthattheobjectivesofUrbanRenewalandthey shouldnotbedeterministic.

Thereisneedtodevelopaframeworkandcriteria withwhichtoinvolve fundersintheprogramandtoensurerespectabilitywithrespecttotheir requirements.

4,7. DEPARTMENTOFARTSANDCULTUREBEAUTIFICATIONPROJECT FUNDING

ThereisR1,5millionavailablefromtheDepartmentofArtsandCulture Beautificationprojectswithinbothnodes.

4,8. MANDELAFUNDFORMITCHELLSPLAINURBANRENEWAL

Thereisanamount of approximately R12 million dedicated to this project from BP and Mitsubishi.

Asignificantamountofprogresshasbeenmadewiththisproject. ItwasagreedthattheDeputyMinistercouldreporttotheprevious Presidentthattheprojectisprogressing satisfactorily.

4.9. REPORTON10YEARBUSINESSPLANFORTHENODES

ThekeychallengeistodevelopavisionandastrategyforMitchellsPlain andKhayelitshaandthiscanonlybedonewithanindepthunderstanding ofthekeyindicatorsanddynamics ofthetwoareas.

Basedonthevisionandstrategyabusinessplancouldbedeveloped whichiscoordinatedwiththebudgetallocationsofthethreelevelsof Governmentintermsoftheirmediumtermexpenditureprogram. Itwasfurtheraskedwhetherther eisaplan,which,coordinatesand guidesUrbanRenewalinanintegratedwayforimplementationoveraten yeartimeframe.

ItwaspointedoutthatthereisnoplananditistheintentionoftheCityto producesuchaplan.

AtaNationallevel,adraf tworkplanhasbeendistributedwiththe intentionofprovidingguidancewithrespecttotheidentificationofprojects. Itisnotexpectedthatthisworkplanbefollowedindetailbutthatitbea guide.

IntermsoftheDivisionofRevenueAct,Natio nalGovernmentmust stipulatea3yearallocationtoUrbanRenewalanditwouldbeadvisable fortheCityandtheProvincetodothesameinordertostrengthenthe program.
