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1. INTRODUCTION

In terms of section 18 of the Liquor Act, 1989 (Act No 27 of 1989) (the Act), the Memberof the Executive Council shall as soon as possible after 1 January in each year lodge a report on the Liquor Board's activities during the preceding year, through the agency of the Premier, with the national Ministerof Trade and Industry. This report relates to the activities of the Liquor Board of the Western Cape and the Sub-Directorate: Business Licensing, in the Department of Economic Affairs, Agriculture and Tourism, who acts as secretariat to the Board for the period 1 January 2001 to 31 December 2001.

Thereportfurtherfunctions as a report to the Western Cape Province's Standing Committee on Public Accounts on the activities of the Western Cape Liquor Board as a public entity interms of the provisions of the Public Finance Management Act, No1 of 1999 for the period 1 April 2001 to 31 March 2002.

2. THELIQUORBOARD

2.1 CompositionoftheLiquorBoard

Section7oftheLiquorActprovidesfortheappointmentbytheMemberof theExecutiveCouncilinaprovinceoftheprovincialLiquorBoard.The compositionoftheLiquorBoardoftheWesternCapewasnotchanged duringtheyear2001.TheBoardconsistsof:

Thecreationofaninspectorateconsistingofthreestaffmembershas enhancedtheLiquorBoard'sabilitytodealwithcomplaintsregarding licensedpremises.TheInspectorateprovidesaliaisonfunctionwiththe successfulsystemofdesignatedpoliceofficerslocatedateverypolice stationintheWesternCape,operatingunderthecontrolofS/Suptvan Lill.

TheInspectorateisfurtherresponsibleforawarenessandeducation campaignslaunchedinconjunctionwithotherroleplayerstoincreasethe numberofliquorlicenceapplicationsfromunlicencedtraders.

3. APPLICATIONSINTERMSOFVARIOUSSECTIONSOFTHEACT

- 3.1 Intermsofsection11readwithsection15oftheActtheBoardmay-
 - refuseanapplication;or
 - grantanapplication;or
 - referanapplicationtotheBoardforahearingofevidenceand consideration.

Altogether102sittingsoftheBoardwereheld,whichconsistedof510 hoursofsitting.1563applicationswereconsidered.Alistofthe applicationsattendedtobythecompetentauthority(theBoardorthe Chairperson)isannexedasannexure1.

3.2 TheChairpersonisrequiredbylawtoreferanapplicationforaliquor licensetotheBoardforconsiderationatapublicmeetingifanobjection hasbeenlodgedagainsttheapplication.Tothisend,theBoardheld18 meetingsatvariouslocationsoutsideCapeTown,throughouttheWestern Cape.Duringsuchmeetingsverbalevidenceandsubmissionswere heard.Duetothepublicinterestinapplicationswhereobjectionshave beenreceived,theBoardheldhearingsinthemagisterialdistrictinwhich theproposedlicensedpremiseswouldbelocated.

3.3 WithintheambitoftheprescriptionsoftheLiquorAct,1989,legal technicalomissionsandfailureswerecondonedinthoseinstanceswhere thecondonationdidnotprejudicethepublicinterest,toassistwiththe developmentofsmall,mediumandmicroenterprises.TheBoardfurther consideredineachapplicationtheinterestsofthepublic,theimpactofthe applicationonjobcreationandtheexistenceorcreationofpossible monopolisticconditions.

4. APPLICATIONSFORTHEWITHDRAWALOFLIQUORLICENSES

5hearingsregardingthewithdrawalorsuspensionofexistingliquor licenseswereheldintermsofsection11(3)(c)oftheAct.In4instances thelicenseswerewithdrawn.Intheotherinstancesadditionalconditions wereimposedonthelicenseholderstoensurethatthecauseofthe complaintswereattendedto.Theseweregenerallyrestaurantsthatwere transgressingtheirlicenseconditionsandtheprovisionsoftheLiquorAct.

5. APPLICATIONSFORREASONSFORDECISIONSTAKEN

Duringtheyearunderreviewthecompetentauthority(theBoardorthe Chairperson)furnishedcomprehensivereasonsin24mattersforits decisions.Unlessindicatedsobelow,noneofthesematterswere proceededwithonreviewintheHighCourt.

6. LEGALPROCEEDINGS

LegalproceedingswereinstitutedagainsttheLiquorBoardintheperiod underreviewinfourinstances.

AnapplicationforthereviewoftherefusalbytheLiquorBoardtogranta restaurantliquorlicencetopremisesinDurbanvillewasnotopposedand thelicencewasgrantedbytheHighCourtofSouthAfrica(CapeofGood HopeProvincialDivision).Thematterhassubsequentlybeenreportedas BulkSixDealsCCvTheLiquorBoardoftheWesternCape2002(2)SA 99(C).

ThreeapplicationsforthereviewoftheLiquorBoard'sdecisionwerefiled ofwhichtwowerewithdrawnwithcosttenderedinourfavourafterthe Chairpersonfiledopposingaffidavits.IntheunreportedmatterofPieter LudovicusMariaAertsh/aLizardsvDieDrankraadvandieWes-Kaap, casenumber1639/2002,arefusalbytheLiquorBoardtograntalicence inaninstancewheretheSouthAfricanPoliceServicesconductedan operationandillegalnarcoticsubstanceswerefoundonapremisesin George,wassuccessfullyopposedbytheLiquorBoard,withacostsorder beinggrantedinfavouroftheLiquorBoardbytheCapeHighCourt.

7. FINANCIALMATTERSRELATINGTOTHEPUBLICFINANCE MANAGEMENTACTASITRELATESTOTHESUBDIRECTORATE: BUSINESSLICENSING

Expenditure

AlthoughtheLiquorBoardislistedasapublicentityinSchedule3ofthe PublicFinanceManagementAct,thefunctionsandfinancesoftheLiquor BoardoftheWesternCapewasadministeredwithintheDepartmentof EconomicAffairs, AgricultureandTourism. The LiquorBoard therefore didnothave an identifiables eparate budget for the period 1 April 2001 to 31 March 2002. The functions of the LiquorBoard were funded through the Sub-programme: Business Regulation (responsibility: Business Licensing). It is important to note that while the administration of the LiquorBoard is assigned to the SubDirectorate: Business Licensing, the Sub-directorate is also responsible for other, unrelated tasks. The budget assigned to the responsibility is therefore not exclusively for its duties of administration of the LiquorBoard.

TheDepartmentofEconomicAffairs,AgricultureandTourismreportson thesaidresponsibilityinthenormalcourseofitsreportingonthe departmentalbudgetfortheyear2001.

Revenue

Revenueisgenerated through the issuing of liquorlicences and the annual renewal fees. Interms of the provisions of the Liquor Act, the Receiver of Revenue shall be the collecting agent for the revenue raised through the administration of liquorlicences. A list indicating the income received perlicence category for the period 1 April 2001 to 31 March 2002 is annexed as annexure 2.

Thereconciliation of the receipts with the income received from the Head Office of the Receiver of Revenue remains problematic. It is for essent hat new provincial legislation on liquor licensing will address this issue.
