## BOOKS AND AUTHORS

### The dressing station tops

Jonathan Kaplan's book **The dressing station** was recently voted by booksellers as the one they most enjoyed reading, promoting and selling last year. Kaplan's prize money was R50 000.

The other finalists were **The restless supermarket** by Ivan Vladislavic, **At the fireside** by Roger Webster, **Sachs Street** by Rayda Jacobs, **Don't let's go to the dogs to-night** by Alexandra Fuller and **Raaiselkind** by Annelie Botes.

Jonathan Ball/HarperCollins was judged the country's best publisher of the year and Exclusive Books on the Square, Sandton Square, the top bookseller. Kwela Books was commended by the jurors for its support of South African writing.

Merit awards went to two specialist booksellers: Clarke's Bookshop in Cape Town for its focus on special interest books and its success in developing an export business, and Boekhuis in Johannesburg.

Sponsored by Whitaker Information Services of the United Kingdom, the annual Sefika Awards promote excellence in the local publishing industry.

### 'New Dickens in the making'

A Dutch-born novelist living in a converted railway station in the Scottish Highlands has Hollywood all abuzz.

Literary critics have hailed 42-year-old Michel Faber as the new Charles Dickens and movie moguls are clamouring to film his tale of a prostitute sleeping her way to the top in 19th Century London society.

The book, being published in Britain this week, was first started by Faber in 1981.

'I have rewritten it twice since then - three radically different versions. I was studying the Victorian era at the time I conceived it, so that must have influenced my choice of period,' Faber said.

Faber did not start learning English until he was seven years old. He spent 20 years living in Australia and he and his wife Eva moved to Scotland after falling in love with the Highlands while on holiday there.

His jobs ranged from nurse to pickle packer and from cleaner to guinea pig for medical research.

'I share the writing with my wife so it's not a lonely profession at all. I give my wife each chapter or section as soon as I've drafted it and we discuss it in great detail. She is an excellent critic,' he said.

### Skrywer inwoner van die jaar

Die skrywer-pedagoog, PH Nortjé, is onlangs aangewys as Wellington se inwoner van die jaar.

Nortjé, ook bekend as Oom Henry, is deur die plaaslike Rapportryers-beweging gekies as die dertiende *Wellingtoner van die Jaar* uit erkenning vir die wyse waarop hy die dorp in sy skryfwerk aan die land bekend gestel het.

In die jare vyftig en sestig het hy 'n reeks sketse oor dié dorp se inwoners vir **Die Huisgenoot** geskryf. 'n Keur hiervan het verskyn onder die titel, **Wellingtonse suiker**.

Ander boeke uit sy pen is **Die wildedruif val**, **Die groen ghoen**, waarvoor hy die Scheepers Prys vir Jeuglektuur ontvang het, en die mees onlangse **Korsies van growwebrood**.

### Prente laat kinders reis

Toe Piet Grobler se jongste kinderboek, **Net één slukkie, Padda!**, onlangs in Nederland bekend gestel is, het die media tougestaan om onderhoude met hom te voer. In 17 dae het hy met 14 joernaliste gepraat.

'Die mark in Nederland is soveel anders as hier in Suid-Afrika,' sê Grobler. 'In Amsterdam en Utrecht is daar, byvoorbeeld, twee winkels in elk van dié stede wat net kinderboeke verkoop.'

Hy vind groter aanklank by die Europese tekenkuns as by dié van die Britte. 'Die Angelsaksiese kunstenaars is meer geneig tot realisme of interpretasies terwyl Europeërs meer eksperimenteel en meer geneig is tot abstraksie.' Sy persoonlike biblioteek van prentboeke trek al by 200 en sluit werke van regoor die wêreld in.

'Ek dink mense wat prentboeke skep, het 'n sekere soort waardering vir die kind se wêreld. Maar ek sal nooit so arrogant wees om te sê ek verstaan dié wêreld nie. Ek was te lank gelede 'n kind.'

## LITERÊRE TOEKENNINGS

### Kortverhale met Sanlam pryse bekroon

Die wenners van vanjaar se Sanlam literêre pryse (vir kortverhale) is onlangs bekend gemaak.

Ashraf Jamal het die toekenning gekry vir beste gepubliseerde storie (**The shades**) en

die Johannesburgse skrywer en akteur Renos Spanoudes het ook pryse gekry vir twee van sy ongepubliseerde stories (*Mercury* en *The apple tree* en *Of goats and roses* wat 'n plek deel).

Naaswenners in die kategorie vir gepubliseerde stories, is K Sello Duiker met **Giant** en Shawn de Waal vir sy storie, **Exposure**. Jacky Uys was in die derde plek in die ongepubliseerde kategorie met *The secret*.

### Nobel pryswenner

Imre Kertesz, 'n Hongaar wat as tiener in Auschwitz oorleef het, is met die Nobel Prys vir Letterkunde bekroon.

Sy werk is beskryf as skryfkuns wat die 'brosse ervaring van die individu teen die barbaarse willekeurigheid van die geskiedenis staande hou'. Die Sweedse akademie het sy 1975 debuutroman, **Sorstalansag** (**Sonder lotsbestemming**), uitgesonder.

Die 72-jarige Kertesz, 'n Jood wat in Boedapest gebore is, is in 1944 na Auschwitz gedeporsteer en daarna na Buchenwald, waar hy in 1945 vrygelaat is.

**Sorstalansag** was die eerste boek in 'n trilogie wat oor die Joodse massaslagting handel. **A kudarc** (**Fiasko**) het in 1988 verskyn en **Kaddish a meg nem szueletett** (**Kaddish vir 'n ongebore kind**) in 1990.

### CBSA pryswenners

Die Christian Booksellers Association of South Africa (CBSA) het die **Liedboek van die kerk** aangewys as die beste publikasie van die jaar. **Innie skylte vannie Jirre** van Hans du Plessis is tweede en Max Lucardo se **Hy het die doringkroon gekies**, derde. Die CBSA bekroon jaarliks boeke van uitgewers van Christelike materiaal in 11 kategorieë. In die afdeling vir kinderlektuur is **Ek wil ook bid** van Anna-Marié Ackermann as die beste aangewys. Ronell Bezuidenhout se **God in your life** is gekies as die beste jeugboek. **Innie skylte vannie Jirre** is die wenner in die kategorie algemeen Christelik. Braam Hanekom se **Man met balans** is die beste dagboek. Die **Liedboek van die kerk** is ook die wenner in die kategorie teologie, ernstige nie-fiksie.

Die beste vertaling is **Hy het die doringkroon gekies**. Adrio König se **Fokus op die 300 geloofsvrae wat mense die meeste vra** is die wenner in die kategorie, huwelik en gesin. **Eksodus** van Barend Vos is die beste boek in die kategorie vir fiksie. In die kategorie vir toerustingsmateriaal het **Só glo ons**, waarvan Piet Meiring die redakteur is, met die louere weggestap. Die beste

geskenkboekie is Ampie Barnard se **God verstaan jou hart**. 'n Spesiale toekenning is gedoen aan die **Holy Bible: Contemporary English version** (kleuromslag).

## McEwan Exclusive pryswenner

**Atonement**, die Brit Ian McEwan se negende roman, is vanjaar die wenner van Exclusive Books se Boeke Prys. Dié prys, ook bekend as die ama-Boeke-Boeke, word toegeken aan gehalteboeke wat ook toeganklik is. Die wenner is deur 28 Suid-Afrikaanse resensente aangewys. Die ander benoemdes is **Balzac and the little Chinese seamstress** deur Dai Sijie, **The blind assassin** deur Margaret Atwood, **The constant gardener** deur John le Carré, **The bonesetter's daughter** deur Amy Tan en **Five quarters of the orange** deur Joanne Harris.

## Vatmaar skrywer kry prys

Die Patrick Petersen Gedenk Prys is onlangs aan die skrywer AHM Scholtz oorhandig. Petersen, 'n digter-dominee, was die eerste voorsitter van die ASV en is in 1997 oorlede.

Scholtz het bekendheid verwerf met sy boek, **Vatmaar**, en is die derde ontvanger van dié toekenning ná Elsa Joubert en Adam Small. **Vatmaar** is met die Eugène Marais-, CNA- en M-Net Prys bekroon en in verskeie tale vertaal.

## Prys vir boek oor wittes

'n Akademikus van die Universiteit van Kaapstad het 'n internasionale boekprys losgeslaan vir haar werk oor wit Suid-Afrikanners se konflik in hul strewe om te vernuwe.

Melissa Steyn het met **Whiteness just isn't what it used to be: white identity in a changing South Africa** die Outstanding Book Award van die internasionale kommunikasie-afdeling van die Nasionale Kommunikasievereniging (NCA) in Amerika verower.

Haar boek is eenparig deur resensente geprys vir die bydrae tot 'interkulturele kommunikasie, die streng teoretiese benadering, die insigryke ontleding en die uitstekende skryfwerk'.

Steyn ontvang in November haar prys op 'n NCA konferensie in New Orleans.

DC Comics, Brittanje se grootste uitgewer van strokiesverhale en die internasionale handelsmerk agter Superman en Batman, het in 'n poging om nuwe lesers te lok die eerste keer gay superhelde bekend gestel. In 'n radikale afwyking van die tradisionele verhaal waarin die superheld altyd die guns van die beeldskone vrou wen, het die nuwe uitgawe van **The authority** twee gay mans, Apollo en Midnigher, as helde. Die twee trou en neem 'n kind aan. In die Britse dagblad, **The Observer**, berig 'n woordvoerder vir DC Comics, dat die Britse lewenstyl verander en strokies moet dié verskuiving reflekteer.

### 11 September herdenk

In Amerika is die 11 September-terreur onder meer gedenk deur minstens 100 boeke oor dié aanval wat binnekort verskyn. Een

van die boeke is **Leadership** deur die voormalige New Yorkse burgemeester, Rudolph Giuliani.

## Wes-Kaap biblioteke kry wel nuwe boeke

Die Wes-Kaapse Provinsiale Biblioteekdiens het in reaksie op berigte dat dié diens toenemend agteruitgaan, gesê daar is 'kommerwekkende agterstande ten opsigte van personeel en diensure', maar dis onwaar dat nuwe boeke nie meer verskaf word nie.

Hannetjie du Preez, hoofdirekteur van Kultuursake, het gesê in 2001 het die Provinsiale Biblioteekdiens byna 'n kwart miljoen nuwe boeke en 10 000 oudiovisuele items aan geregistreerde dienspunte verskaf.

Die 71 openbare biblioteke in Kaapstad wat by die Provinsiale Biblioteekdiens geregistreer is, het 124 271 van dié boeke ontvang.

Sy het bygevoeg dat die beskikbare geld en syfers vir 2002 daarop dui dat dié getal vanjaar dieselfde kan wees, of kan styg.

Daar is 315 openbare biblioteekdienspunte in die Wes-Kaap, waarvan 280 by die provinsiale biblioteekdiens geregistreer is om materiaal te ontvang. Dit sluit 71 openbare biblioteke in wat binne die Kaapse metropool geleë is.

Die ander 35 voormalige onafhanklike stadsbiblioteke is nou ook binne die metropool en die samesmelting van dié biblioteke word deur die stad bestuur.

Die Wes-Kaap het 1,2 miljoen biblioteeklede en verlede jaar is 24,7 miljoen items gesirkuleer waarvan boeke die gewildste was.

Die sirkulasie van volwasse Afrikaanse fiksie het verlede jaar met 1,9% gestyg en Xhosa-verhale met 2,9%. Engelse verhale se gewildheid het met 1,8% toegeneem.

## Kaapse Bibliotekaris 40 jaar gelede

- ★ CJ Fourie maak 'n groot betoog uit vir die klassifikasie van boeke volgens leserbelangstelling. Vir die gewone gebruikers van openbare biblioteke sê hy is die Deweystelsel eerder 'n beslommernis as 'n hulp.
- ★ An American invention announced in 1962 was a machine that smelled out stolen books. A dab of fragrance not normally noticeable by the human nose is placed on every book. The dab is removed at the issue desk when the book is taken out in the ordinary lawful manner; but beyond the desk an automatic sensing device reacts to books still carrying the dab.
- ★ The Cape Town region was featured in a very comprehensive article. An interesting aspect was the service to the navy, with six floating depots on board a variety of military vessels. Books were even sent to England where the ships were being built.
- ★ Die Kaapse Provinsiale Biblioteekdiens kondig 'n leserkundige opname aan wat gedurende 1963 by openbare biblioteke onderneem sou word. Die doel van hierdie ondersoek was om te bepaal in hoe 'n mate die Biblioteekdiens suksesvol was met die leesmateriaal wat aan biblioteke verskaf is.
- ★ Ek is oortuig daarvan dat Oubaas van **Sewende Laan** in 1962 vir die Biblioteekdiens moes gewerk het. Met geveleude woorde word Malmesburystreek beskryf. 'Die landskapskoon is 'n groeiende beloning vir die bibliotekaris, met gespierde bergspitse, die sagte ronding van heuwels, wye vlaktes waar die bobbejane vir die biblioteek padgee. Daar is onoortreflike blommeprag, boorde met morge bloeiselkleur en gedissiplineerde wingerdstokke.' (sic)

The 'eish' in Bookeish! is a township term expressing a positive surprise or exclamation. 'Eish!' means 'Wow!'.

'This is not a literacy drive but one that invites South Africans to acquire the pleasures and benefit of recreational reading in whatever areas excite their interest,' says director Graeme Bloch.
