### **BILL**

As determined in section 226(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996 (Act 108 of 1996) and section 58(2) of the Constitution of the Western Cape, 1997 (Act 1 of 1998) amounts of money are appropriated for the financial needs of the Western Cape Provincial Government in the financial year that begins on 1 April 2005 and ends on 31 March 2006.

**B**E IT ENACTED BY THE PROVINCIAL PARLIAMENT of the Province of the Western Cape, as follows: -

# Appropriation of amounts of money for the financial needs of Western Cape Provincial Government

1. Subject to the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999), there are hereby appropriated out of the Provincial Revenue Fund for the requirements of the Western Cape Provincial Government in respect of the financial year ending 31 March 2006 the amounts of money for the indicated budget votes, main divisions and purposes listed in the Schedule.

#### Short title and commencement

**2.** This Act is called the Western Cape Appropriation Act, 2005 and comes into operation on 1 April 2005.

### **EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM**

## **WESTERN CAPE APPROPRIATION BILL**

The Bill provides for the appropriation of amounts of money for the requirements of the Provincial Government: Western Cape to be withdrawn from the Provincial Revenue Fund in respect of the financial year ending 31 March 2006, as per the Schedule attached to the Bill.
