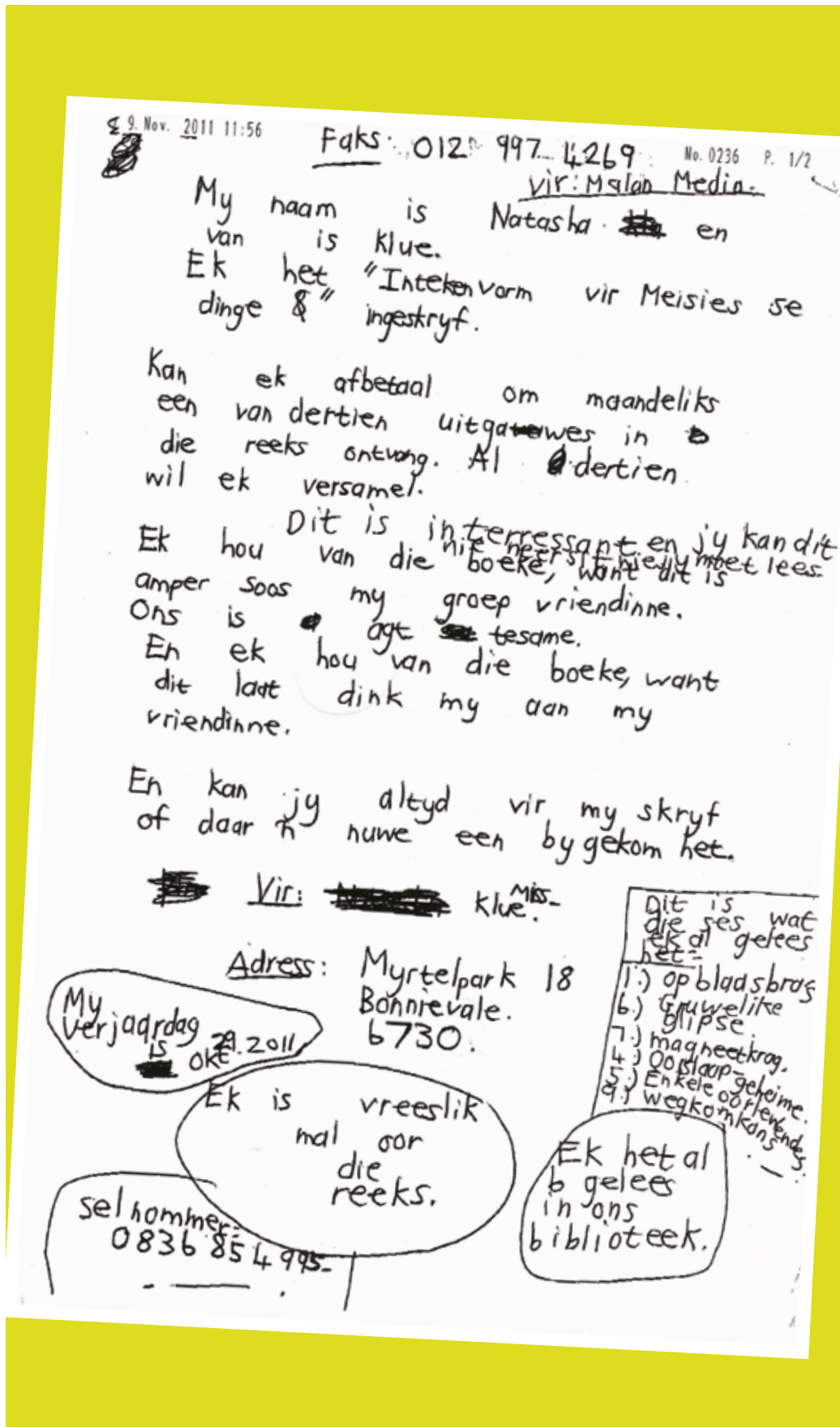

## Celebrate the book! National Book Week 2011

As part of this year's celebration of National Book Week the Western Cape Provincial Library Service, in partnership with the City of Cape Town Libraries, showcased a 'demo library' - *getting to know your library* at the Liberty Promenade Shopping Mall in Mitchell's Plain from 5-10 September. National Book Week 2011 – a joint project by the South African Book Development Council (SABDC) and the Department of Arts and Culture – was introduced to celebrate the book and a love of reading. As part of a national effort to embrace the value of reading and the important role it plays in a nation's development, a satellite National Book Week was held in Cape Town with the main event held in Gauteng. This was a networking opportunity for all involved in reading promotions.

The event coincided with the launching of a poster on 8 September 2011 to celebrate International Literacy Day.

To symbolise the kick-off of the Rugby World Cup a colourful poster sporting the Springbok captain, John Smith, with the slogan, *Unite behind the Boks@your library ... the Boks always play by the book* was also launched on 9 September 2011 by Dr Ivan Meyer, Minister of Cultural Affairs and Sport. Dr Meyer also officially opened National Book

Week. The opening was attended by local public librarians, staff of the Department of Cultural Affairs and Sport, Provincial Library Service staff, the media, City of Cape Town library staff and members of the public.

As one of the biggest shopping malls in the Western Cape the Liberty Promenade Shopping Mall in Mitchell's Plain was the ideal venue for hosting National Book Week 2011. Its position lends itself to reaching out to a broad sector of the community that can attract many potential library users. The choice of the Mitchell's Plain community was based on the fact that it is currently facing social and economical challenges. This project and the subsequent exposure of National Book Week, together with the launching of posters for International Literacy Day and the Rugby World Cup had a positive effect in the community as could be seen by the number of people who visited the 'demo library'. Visitors showed tremendous interest in books, libraries and reading. During this week library staff from neighbouring public libraries (Mitchell's Plain, Rocklands, Brown's Farm, Weltevreden and Khayelitsha) assisted at the 'demo library'.

In order to familiarise people who have never been in a library before with the look and feel of one, the 'demo library' was 'built' using three 'walls' of banners, depicting

library shelves with books, a Wheelie Wagon complete with books, computers, a loan and issuing desk, seating facilities, promotional material, posters and library application forms. The aim of the 'demo library' was to provide for the information, reading and learning needs of the community and to promote a culture of reading, library usage and lifelong learning. The intention was to encourage non-library users to make use of their public libraries and to explain the treasures that can be found in them. Members of the public were advised by the staff manning the 'demo library' on how to become a member of their local public library.

Interesting activities were presented during the week which included projects and workshops such as bookmaking, reading classes for the elderly, story hours and face-painting for children, exhibitions, current awareness and guidance on how to become a library member. More than 10 people attended the bookmaking workshop and more than 15 elderly people attended the reading class. More than 5,000 children were reached during story hours, face-painting sessions and promotional hand-outs.

On the last day of National Book Week a group of eight cyclists visited the 'demo library' with books to be donated to people in Mitchell's Plain as part of the

Books-on-Bike outreach project. This initiative donates books to people in need. The media, their organisers and trainers were present. Between 5,000-10,000 people visited the 'demo library' - *getting to know your library*. Hundreds of application forms to become members of their local public library were completed and will be allocated to relevant public libraries all over the Cape Peninsula.

The event was promoted extensively in public libraries and in the media, which resulted in high profile interviews on radio stations, news coverage on the Cape Gateway web site and in various local newspapers. It is estimated that the message reached more than 1.2 million library users and approximately three million people in Cape Town.

In all, the 'demo library' - *getting to know your library* was a successful endeavor to bring about a reading awareness amongst non-members public libraries.

## An exercise in marketing

With the generous book donations that Bellville Library regularly receives from the community, there has also been a steady stream of old vinyl records (LPs and 7-singles) over the years. Mostly technology seemed to have overtaken these old

recordings, but obviously some were also just part of packing up the family home and downsizing to a townhouse or retirement home.

The LPs varied from pristine collections of the classical masters to big names in the then popular culture to mass-market compilations and to children's songs. The problem was that the library ended up with a few hundred of these records which just gathered dust and took up space in the storerooms. In the spirit of the library maxim of 'the right book at the right time for the right person', staff were sure that there were people out there who would still be interested in some of these records, but it was just not so easy to match the two.

Coinciding with one of their regular secondhand book sales, however, they recently tried a new marketing strategy. In a glass display case, prominently placed, they displayed examples of the LPs, and invited



people to buy a record 'for the music' (the classics); 'for nostalgia' (remember Groep Twee, the BeeGees?); 'for crafts' (displaying an example, courtesy of their creative Edgemead colleague Lorraine Matthewson, of a scrapbooked photo collage on an LP); 'for retro chic' décor (colourful record sleeves); 'for creative underplates' (some records were rather scratched or without sleeves); and 'for original invitations' (a 7-single record with an invitation to a 21st birthday party).

The initiative paid off generously: all the records were sold (admittedly only for R2 each!) - the cheeky 'while stocks last' line probably did not hurt sales! It was a very successful marketing exercise: it generated a lot of interest and attracted many new people to the library.

islands, a compilation of essays on Calypso in post-independence Trinidad and Tobago by Gordon Rohlehr; **The Caribbean writer**, the silver anniversary issue on Haiti (2011); and **The shebeen tales** by Chenjerai Hove. 'At Open Book in Cape Town, I met the young South African writer; Thando Mqolozana who wrote **A man who is not a man** – an impressive debut novel,' said Lovelace.

His books include **While gods are falling**, **The dragon can't dance** and **Salt**, which won him the 1997 Commonwealth Writers' Prize.

**Wat die water onthou** is Esterhuizen se agtste bundel en sy derde by Protea Boekhuis. Dit is ook vroeër vanjaar vir die ATKV-Woordveertjetoekenning vir digkuns benoem.

Johan Lodewyk Marais en Melt Myburgh is ook vir die Protea Prys benoem – Marais vir **Diorama** en Myburgh vir **Oewer bestaan**, sy debuutbundel wat vroeër vanjaar die Ingrid Jonker Prys gewen het. Myburgh het by dieselfde geleentheid sy prys van die organiseerder, Caro Wiese, ontvang.

Dit is die 56-jarige Esterhuizen se eerste prys. Hy was voorheen onderwyser en adjunkhoof van Pretoria Boys' High School; later vakhoof vir Afrikaans by Rondebosch Boys' High School in Kaapstad. Sedert Junie 2002 is hy bestuurder van Protea Boekwinkel in Stellenbosch, bekend vir veral hul Saterdagpraatjies met skrywers.

Esterhuizen se debuutbundel, **Stilstuip**, het in 1986 by Human & Rousseau verskyn. Van sy verse is ook in talle bloemesings opgeneem, onder meer **Die Afrikaanse poë-**

**sie in 'n 1000 en enkele gedigte en Groot verseboek**.

Die prys behels R10,000 en 'n geraamde protea.

#### Eskom powers a spirit of reading

Eskom, in partnership with the City of Cape Town Library Services' Districts 3 and 4 hosted the annual Reading Competition on Friday, 16 September 2011 at the Belhar Civic Centre.

The purpose of the reading competition is to create a passion for reading and boost the low literacy levels amongst learners. South Africa faces big challenges in this regard, and the media regularly report on the low levels of reading abilities and skills amongst children in South Africa.

The theme of this year's reading piece was about *Climate change*, how to recycle, re-use and rethink. The reading piece, *It all starts with us* was written by Pearl Boltman, an intern at the Marketing Services Department in Edgemead. The learners were tested on their reading ability, comprehension and spelling. About 18 learners competed in the 2011 Inter-district Reading Competition in the English, isiXhosa, and Afrikaans categories. These learners are the winners in the district finals where approximately 320 learners participated in the preliminaries to the Inter-district Competition.

The geographical area of Districts 3 and 4 consist of low income communities with economical, educational and social challenges. Unemployment, illiteracy, high levels of school drop-out and crime are daily occurrences in all of these communities. The public library is the only recreational place in most, if not all, of these areas.

The guests were entertained by the extremely talented Bridgetown Community Theatre Group.

## Bedbugs in books alarm libraries

Libraries love bookworms, but book bugs? Not so much.

Lower Mainland libraries in British Columbia, Canada are advising the public to report bedbugs found in loaned books after a New Westminster library shut its doors for a day for pest control. An inspection by bedbug-sniffing dogs revealed that there were bugs in certain books. After a steamcleaning and heat treatment the library was re-opened.

Two libraries in Burnaby dealt with the pests earlier when the bugs were detected at its Metrotown and Cameron street branches. The locations were treated and library staff are now checking each book for the bugs as they are returned.

'It's the first time we've had them in New West, but it's not going to be the last time,' New Westminster city councillor Jaimie McEvoy said. 'I would say that every library should check [for bedbugs] on a regular basis. It's not just a one-time thing. It's part of life now. There is a public health issue there, in most cases a relatively minor public health issue, like lice, but they can carry infections.'

Ons ken almal sulke mense – hulle stal die boeke uit waar almal hulle kan sien, soos in die sitkamer – en ek verbeel my hulle sal ook hul geraamde graadsertifikate in hulle studeerkamer of werksplek tentoonstel: alles bewyse van geleerdheid (lees: status, nie kennis nie), soos ander mense medaljes sal dra of rosette en bekere uitstal.

Ai, wat 'n vermorsing. Ek kan dink aan talle ander mense wat graag daardie boeke sou wou lees, daar waar hulle nou stof verjaar: En dan, sê Jordaan, is daar ook diegene

wat die boeke lees, maar slegs om te kan spog met hulle kennis – uiteraard oppervlakkig, soos diegene wat verse uit *Die Bybel/Koran/Shakespeare/Grondwet* of wat-ook-al kan aframmel, sonder om te weet waaroor dit eintlik gaan. Jy kry sulke musiekkenners ook – hy/sy kan enige lied hoor en dadelik sê wie, wat, waar en wanneer. Maar van die binnewerke en betekenis van die musiek weet hulle niks: die betekenis van die lirieke, die aanwending van die instrumente, die konteks van die tyd, die kommentaar op ander kunstenaars se werk ... bokkerol. Kunsversamelaars: ditto.

Jordaan sê dit gaan nie oor punt een tot twaalf miljoen nie, maar oor die wysheid wat die boeke bring – daarom moet mens eintlik die regte boek op die regte tyd lees. Wat beteken dit? Miskien dat jy as leser moet wéét dat dit die regte boek op die regte tyd was: dat jy moet wéét wat die boek regtig sê. En dalk meer as een boek, in dié tyd. Die sinergie van boeke? Miskien, maar dalk eerder die boodskap in 'n spesifieke teks – dis daar, al die tyd, maar jy moet dit raaklees en die inhoud ontsluit. Wanneer dit saak maak.

## Minister hosts 'gogos' from Langa Book Club

On 20 September 2011, Dr Ivan Meyer, Minister of Cultural Affairs and Sport in the Western Cape, hosted a Thank You breakfast for the 'gogos' of the Nomzamo Book Club as part of the ongoing celebration of National Book Week.

The club consists of a group of approximately 35 women from Langa who read to children and the elderly in their community.

Minister Meyer met the 'gogos' during National Book Week and was so impressed with their selfless contribution to the community that he wanted to meet them again and talk about how important their work is in improving the literacy levels of our youth.

Dr Meyer also handed out certificates to the women present with the wording,

*For opening the doors to knowledge, creativity, and opportunity for our youth.*



En dit toepas, anders is dit ook maar net van akademiese belang.

Dan sê Jordaan dat daar ook diegene is wat boeke bymekaar hark om na die prentjies te kyk – hier sal fotografe en illustreerders seker gebelg voel, want hulle werke is immers ook belangrik, maar daar is uiteraard 'n verskil tussen staar en inneem, al is laasgenoemde ook dalk nie die ideaal nie. Koffietafelboeke, selfs resepteboeke deesdae, is nie die sondaars nie, maar die versoekings. Miskien moet 'n mens sulke dwase aan strokiesboeke bekendstel; dan leer hulle, byvoorbeeld, 'n paar Latynse frases in **Asterix the gladiator**. Maar, o wee, dit sal tog net gebruik word om andere te imponeer: 'Nos morituri Salutant vos' mag skielik 'die neus van 'n dooie Selakant lyk soos 'n jakkals' word – dus ook nie aan te beveel nie.

En dan kom Jordaan by die grensdraad en klim oor: daar is ook dwase wat niksseggende boeke skryf, sê hy. Aan die ander kant van die venster; wat dalk 'n spieël kan wees, staan die outjies en vroultjies wat seepkissies soek om hulle diep 'insiggies, gedagtetjies en gevoelentjies' as 'vername rigtingwysers vir die mensdom' aan te bied. Hulle is deesdae diegene wat blogs oorheers en skynbaar dag en nag voor die rekenaar sit om die

buitewêreld te beïnvloed. 'Ja', sal hulle gil, daar in hul donker muurwye kamertjies agter toegetrekte blindings, 'En wie is jy, Wilhelm Jor-daan, om ons te oordeel?'

Maar hulle praat hulself gou in 'n hoek, letterlik in daai einste kamertjie, omdat hulle gebrek aan insig deur hulself aan die groot klok gehang word. Gou eggo hul hol frases in hul leë koppe en leë kamers (want daar is nie boeke op hul rakke nie) en blindelings vuur hulle hul loskruitpatrone in die donker af. Buite in die straat hoor iemand dalk doef, doef, doef en dink, 'Die verbrande tieners se musiek maak mens mal. Is hulle deesdae almal dan doof?'

Nee, skryf Jordaan, mense beleef boeke as reisgenote (op reise na ander wêreld), en so ontsnap dié lesers van donker klein kamers na die uiteindes van die verbeelding. 'Om 'n goeie boek te lees, is om in die donker waters van die lewenschaos af te duik en met blink en skoon dinge terug te keer.' Inderdaad: pêrels van wysheid, wat nie voor swyne gewerp moet word nie. Behalwe as jy 'n semel of 'n boekdwaas is. Dan is jy meer verlore as enige seun in enige gelykenis: bloot varkkos. Helaas en sela.

Jordaan is nie die eerste persoon wat boekdwase identifiseer nie – hy noem mense soos Sebastian Brandt wat in

1494 reeds hieroor gespot het in sy **Das Narrenschiff** en Geiler von Kayserberg wat in 1509 'al hekelend 'n aantal boekdwase geëien het'. Die meeste mense wat boeke liefhet (om die regte redes) het sekerlik van hierdie verskynsel van 'kyk, ek het ook boeke, en baie' bewus geword, en ná oordenking die patrone herken wat Jordaan uitwys. Juis daarom maak sy stellings impak. By laasgenoemdes/boekliefhebbers, nie by die dwase nie.

Ja'k; in die dae wat boeke te duur is vir 'gewone' mense, of eerder vir mense met 'n gedurige honger vir boeke, maar te veel ander gate het om toe te stop, terwyl miljoene ander verkies om soos beeste en skape voort te strompel na net nog 'n dag in Suburbia, hul suwwe breine oorspoel met elektroniese data wat hulle self meer verdoof en desensitiseer; ja in dié dae, is daar waaragtig nog boekdwase wat boeke, die kosbare enteite, vermors soos vrates kos mors by 'n MacDonalds vreetkompetisie.

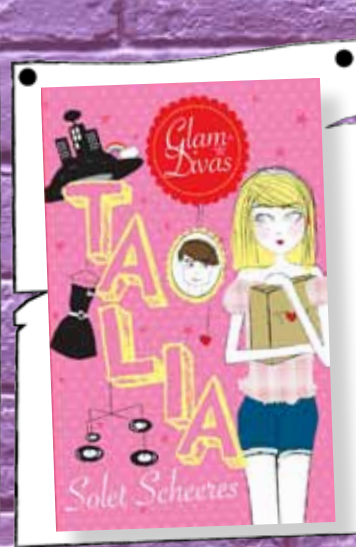
## Kaapse Bibliotekaris 40 JAAR GELEDE ...

Stefan Wehmeyer Adjunkdirekteur: Streke

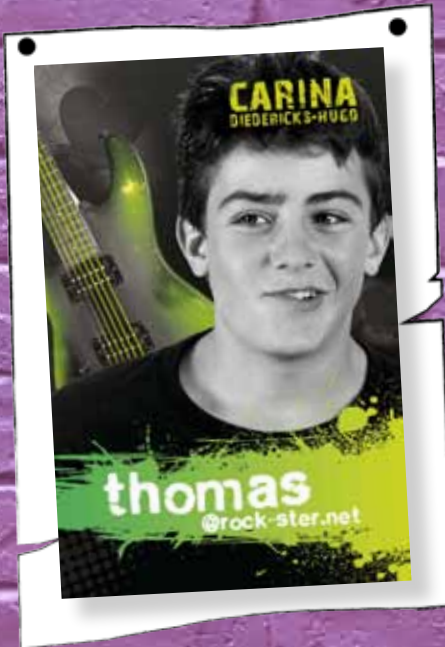
- ▶ Johan Nel skryf in 'n artikel, *Deurbraak vir uitgewers*, oor die redes vir die toenemende gewildheid van Afrikaanse boeke. 'Daarvoor is daar baie redes: die vernaamste is sekerlik die feit dat ons puik, moderne provinsiale biblioteekstelsel, wat gedurende die vyftigerjare landwyd ontplooi het, sy invloed gedurende die jare sestig laat voel het: ons mense het, danksy die deeglike netwerk van biblioteke, begin lees.'
- ▶ Die **KB** wy 'n hele artikel met illustrasies aan Albrecht Dürer wat in 1471 gebore is. Hierdie skilder word soos volg beskryf: Onuitputlik van vindingrykheid, noukeurig in waarneming, onfeilbaar van hand, was hy ook buitengewoon van intellek en Melanchton het van hom gesê dat sy kuns slegs 'n fraksie gevorm het van sy persoonlike grootheid van gees.
- ▶ The **CL** relates the newest ideas from America. A dial-a-story system was introduced in Wyoming. Children from four to ten could phone the library whereupon a story was told by 'Miss Tell-a-Bell'. The service was so popular that extra staff had to man the telephone lines.
- ▶ Mary Kleinschmidt, (former head of the Publications Section) interviewed the well-known South African author Joy Packer: 'I am woken at 06:30 and start work at 07:30, whether I am in the mood or not. I accept no invitations before late afternoon. I do my writing in wire-bound student's notebooks and my secretary has somehow learned to read my ghastly handwriting and abbreviations. I never read my books once they have been published.'
- ▶ An article appeared to highlight the dangers of substance abuse: 'There does exist, concomitantly, a twilight zone of dubious substances, both organic and synthetic, which are in disrepute – dagga, heroin, LSD and the amphetamines, and these substances which CLAIM TO DO FOR US WHAT WE CANNOT OURSELVES DO are here to stay.'
