

# FOR WRITERS: a booklist

#### **Book Selector**

he public library can be a valuable resource for writers. Whether you're an established writer wanting to improve your craft or an aspiring writer just starting out, don't forget about your public library. The Western Cape Library Service has many books on writing and publishing — some of these will be available in your local library, others need to be borrowed from larger libraries or from our Central Reference Section (SN) in Cape Town. We have built up quite a good collection of books on writing in SN. The public library can also be a good place to find out about writing groups in your area or can serve as a venue for starting your own group.

I've compiled a list of some of the books in the Library Service. This list is not exhaustive, but I've tried to select titles which will give you an idea of the scope and variety of our stock. There are many different types of books, some written by writers, others by publishers or editors. We also stock a selection of general books about the craft of writing and more specific books about particular types of writing, like writing a screenplay, a science fiction novel or a biography. There are both inspirational and more practical books. The list also contains creative writing books, books about writing for a particular readership (like children or teenagers), how-to guides providing tips and practical advice at ways of improving your writing, and there are language usage and style manuals, and many others. I have included only a few of these language reference works in my list but we have many others in stock which are just as good. These can be very useful to the writer, not only providing clarification about grammar and correct usage (for example, effect/affect, uninterested/disinterested), but also about the right, or accepted, way of writing certain names, foreign words, and so on. Obviously, this becomes much more important when writing non-fiction. The booklist also contains books about specific aspects of creative writing like characterisation, plot and how to create realistic dialogue.

Many writers will be interested in the books on publishing and how to get published. A number of local books will be very helpful in this regard. To make it easier I have separated the local titles in a section at the beginning of the booklist. Basil van Rooyen, a retired publisher's book, is particularly informative about mainstream

commercial publishing while Heather Parker Lewis's chattier, more anecdotal book provides a wealth of information about self-publishing. I strongly recommend **A rough guide to small-scale and self-publishing** by Colleen Higgs. She also wrote a short article on how to get published in the Jan/Feb 2006 issue of the **Cape Librarian**. She is well-known for her sterling work at the Centre for the Book, particularly with the Community Publishing Project.

The Centre for the Book is a unit of the National Library of South Africa. Its mission is to promote a South African culture of reading, writing and publishing in all local languages, and easy access to books for all South Africans. It's an important organisation for any new writer to be aware of and definitely worth contacting. In the Small publishers' catalogue and the Guide to publishing in South Africa you will find information about different publishers and what kind of books they publish. If you are planning on submitting work to a publisher this will help you choose which would be most suitable. It is not easy getting a book published by a mainstream commercial publisher in South Africa. This is due not only to the current economic climate, but also due to the traditionally small book-buying and book-reading market here. Only a very small proportion of books sent to publishers gets published. The large majority of books published locally are textbooks. Local writers should seriously consider self-publishing. There is, of course, vanity publishing too, but it's only recommended in a few instances. Apparently it's quite easy and inexpensive to publish your book as an e-book. In the Small publishers' catalogue there's an interesting article on e-books by Arthur Atwell, co-founder and CEO of the Electric Book Company, a digital publishing company in Cape Town. Free online services are available for converting your book to e-book formats as well as free online sales and distribution services.

The local titles in this section of the booklist are well worth reading and/or consulting that provide a wealth of information for the writer: organisations; publishers and types of publishing; the book trade; writing courses; publications like literary journals; editors and other freelancers; print-on-demand companies; various other resources and links, and much, much more. There are also various blogs which are worth checking out. One that's been recommended to me is Gary Cummiskey's blog <a href="https://dyehard-press.blogspot.com/">http://dyehard-press.blogspot.com/</a>. Using Google, or your preferred search engine, a number of web



sites will come up by simply searching on terms like 'creative writing' or 'how to get published'. However, all this information should be supplemented by information from the Internet. I've listed a few useful web sites below, including one which offers online writing courses.

Also visit individual publisher's web sites as many of them provide information on their submissions policy. Most authors advise researching the different publishers as well as researching the different types of publishing.

Other advice which is common to most of the books in this booklist is: be aware of your reasons for writing and decide who you're writing for; get objective feedback about your work, and above all, read. Many authors warn that writing is not a good way of making money. As Van Rooyen points out: Those international authors who are household names make their money from a steady stream of titles plus extra's like film rights, foreign-language editions, et cetera' (p6).

Whatever you're writing, be it fiction or non-fiction, and whatever your reasons for writing, whether you're aiming for fame and fortune or just something for friends and family to read or simply for your own satisfaction, there should be something for you in this booklist.
